- 9 Section 1. Section 3524 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania

- 11 § 3524. Footrests and [handlebars] handhold.

RELATING TO SIZE, WEIGHT AND LOAD.

- [(a) Passengers.--]Any motorcycle carrying a passenger,
- 13 other than in a sidecar or enclosed cab, shall be equipped with
- 14 footrests and handhold for the passenger.

- 1 [(b) Height of handlebars.--No person shall operate any
- 2 motorcycle with handlebars above shoulder-height of the operator
- 3 while properly seated upon the motorcycle.]

- 5 § 3526. LIGHTED LAMP REQUIREMENTS FOR MOTORCYCLES.
- 6 NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 4302 (RELATING TO
- 7 PERIODS FOR REQUIRING LIGHTED LAMPS), THE OPERATOR OF A
- 8 MOTORCYCLE, MANUFACTURED DURING OR AFTER 1973, UPON A HIGHWAY
- 9 SHALL DISPLAY THE LIGHTED HEAD LAMPS AND OTHER LAMPS AND
- 10 <u>ILLUMINATING DEVICES REQUIRED UNDER CHAPTER 43 (RELATING TO</u>
- 11 <u>LIGHTING EQUIPMENT</u>) AT ALL TIMES.

- 16 (C) APPLICABILITY.--THIS SECTION SHALL NOT APPLY TO
- 17 MOTORCYCLES.
- 18 SECTION 4. SECTION 4901(C) OF TITLE 75 IS AMENDED AND THE
- 19 SECTION IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SUBSECTION TO READ:
- 20 § 4901. SCOPE AND APPLICATION OF CHAPTER.

- 22 (C) PERMIT AUTHORIZING PROHIBITED MOVEMENT. -- IF AN
- 23 OVERWEIGHT OR OVERSIZE MOVEMENT CANNOT BE MADE IN ANY OTHER
- 24 FEASIBLE MANNER, THE PERMIT MAY AUTHORIZE THE MOVEMENT TO BE
- 25 MADE IN CONTRAVENTION TO ANY PROVISION OF THIS TITLE PROVIDED
- 26 THAT:
- 27 (1) THE DEPARTMENT OR LOCAL AUTHORITY DETERMINES THAT
- 28 THE MOVEMENT IS IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST; AND
- 29 (2) THE MOVEMENT IS ESCORTED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE
- 30 POLICE, EXTRA-DUTY PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE OR DEPARTMENT

1	PERSONNEL [WHILE ANY PROVISION OF THIS TITLE IS BEING
2	CONTRAVENED]. IF THE MOVEMENT IS ESCORTED BY EXTRA-DUTY
3	PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE OR DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL, THE
4	FOLLOWING SHALL APPLY:
5	(I) APPROVAL MUST BE OBTAINED FROM THE PENNSYLVANIA
6	STATE POLICE.
7	(II) THE PERMITTEE SHALL BEAR THE EXPENSE OF
8	ESCORTING THE MOVEMENT.
9	(III) EXTRA-DUTY PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE AND
10	DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL SHALL BE IMMUNE FROM CIVIL OR
11	CRIMINAL LIABILITY ARISING FROM ESCORTING A MOVEMENT IN
12	ACCORDANCE WITH THIS PARAGRAPH.

14	(E) DEFINITION AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERM "EXTRA-
15	DUTY PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE" MEANS SWORN MEMBERS OF THE
16	PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE ASSIGNED, ON A VOLUNTARY BASIS, TO
17	PERFORM WORK OUTSIDE OF THEIR REGULARLY SCHEDULED SHIFT ON AN
18	OVERTIME BASIS, TO A DETAIL THAT IS THE EXCLUSIVE ACTIVITY TO BE

PERFORMED DURING THE SHIFT ASSIGNMENT.
