AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated  
2 Statutes, providing for a special plate for the benefit of  
3 women's health research; and establishing the Women's Health  
4 Fund.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
6 hereby enacts as follows:

7 Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated  
8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:

9 § 1361. Women's health registration plate.

10 (a) Plate.--The department, in consultation with the  
11 Department of Health, shall design a women's health  
12 commemorative registration plate. Upon application of any  
13 person, accompanied by a fee of \$35 which shall be in addition  
14 to the annual registration fee, the department shall issue the  
15 plate for a passenger car, motor home, trailer or truck with a  
16 registered gross weight of not more than 9,000 pounds.

17 (b) Use of fee.--

1       (1) Of each fee paid under subsection (a), \$15 shall be  
2       deposited into the Women's Health Fund, which is established  
3       as a special fund in the State Treasury.

4       (2) The Department of Health shall administer the fund  
5       as follows:

6               (i) One-third shall be used for endometriosis  
7               research in this Commonwealth.

8               (ii) Two-thirds shall be used for medical and other  
9               life sciences research on women's health issues in this  
10              Commonwealth.

11       (3) The money in the fund is continuously appropriated  
12       to the fund. This appropriation shall not lapse at the end of  
13       any fiscal year.

14       Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
