A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for judicial administration.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
8	That section 10(c) of Article V be amended to read:
9	§ 10. Judicial administration.
10	* * *
11	(c) The Supreme Court shall have the power to prescribe
12	general rules governing practice, procedure and the conduct of
13	all courts, justices of the peace and all officers serving
14	process or enforcing orders, judgments or decrees of any court
15	or justice of the peace, including the power to provide for
16	assignment and reassignment of classes of actions or classes of

appeals among the several courts as the needs of justice shall 1 require, and for admission to the bar and to practice law, and 2 3 the administration of all courts and supervision of all officers 4 of the Judicial Branch, if such rules are consistent with this 5 Constitution and neither abridge, enlarge nor modify the substantive rights of any litigant, nor affect the right of the 6 7 General Assembly to determine the jurisdiction of any court or justice of the peace, nor suspend nor alter any statute of 8 9 limitation or repose. [All] <u>Except for statutes enacted by the</u> General Assembly relating to venue, all laws shall be suspended 10 11 to the extent that they are inconsistent with rules prescribed 12 under these provisions.

14 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General 15 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the 16 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to 17 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article 18 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in 19 20 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after 21 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

22 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 23 24 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the 25 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the 26 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 27 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 28 29 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the 30 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment 20010H1973B2566 - 2 -

1 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first
2 primary, general or municipal election occurring at least three
3 months after the proposed constitutional amendment is passed by
4 the General Assembly.
