AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for simple assault.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Section 2701 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 6 Consolidated Statutes, mended June 22, 2001 (P.L.605, No.48), is
- 7 amended to read:
- 8 § 2701. Simple assault.
- 9 (a) Offense defined.--A person is quilty of assault if he:
- 10 (1) attempts to cause or intentionally, knowingly or
- 11 recklessly causes bodily injury to another;
- 12 (2) negligently causes bodily injury to another with a
- deadly weapon;

- 1 (3) attempts by physical menace to put another in fear
- of imminent serious bodily injury; or
- 3 (4) conceals or attempts to conceal a hypodermic needle
- 4 on his person and intentionally or knowingly penetrates a law
- 5 enforcement officer or an officer or an employee of a
- 6 correctional institution, county jail or prison, detention
- 7 <u>facility or mental hospital</u>, during the course of an arrest
- 8 or any search of the person.
- 9 (b) Grading.--Simple assault is a misdemeanor of the second
- 10 degree unless committed:
- 11 (1) in a fight or scuffle entered into by mutual
- consent, in which case it is a misdemeanor of the third
- 13 degree; or
- 14 (2) against a child under 12 years of age by an adult 21
- 15 years of age or older, in which case it is a misdemeanor of
- 16 the first degree.
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
