## INTRODUCED BY PERZEL, JANUARY 24, 2001

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON RULES, JANUARY 24, 2001

## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Creating a joint select committee of the General Assembly to examine, investigate and make a complete study of Pennsylvania's election laws, practices and procedures relating to voter eligibility, to the methods of voting, to the casting, counting and recounting of votes, to voter registration, to absentee balloting, to protections against fraud and to legal remedies related thereto.
8	WHEREAS, The United States Supreme Court, in its recent
9	decision in Bush v. Gore, ruled that the absence of uniform
10	standards in Florida for the conduct of a statewide recount of
11	the votes cast for President of the United States at the
12	election held on November 7, 2000, violated the Equal Protection
13	Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States
14	Constitution; and
15	WHEREAS, It is uncertain how expansively the United States
16	Supreme Court and other courts will apply the precedent
17	established by the United States Supreme Court decision in Bush
18	v. Gore whenever those courts are called upon to determine the
19	outcome of elections in future cases; and
20	WHEREAS, It is important that the General Assembly review the

election laws of this Commonwealth and make appropriate
 revisions where necessary in order to assure that Pennsylvania
 avoids any electoral problems should the Commonwealth experience
 an extremely close Statewide election; and

5 WHEREAS, It is necessary for the General Assembly to review 6 the adequacy of the various types of voting systems that are 7 being used throughout this Commonwealth; and

8 WHEREAS, It is imperative that laws, practices and procedures 9 relating to voter eligibility, to the methods of voting, to the 10 casting, counting and recounting of votes, to voter 11 registration, to absentee balloting and legal remedies related 12 thereto are sufficient to assure the conduct of an accurate and

13 fair election; therefore be it

14 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That a joint select 15 committee on election reform be created and be authorized to 16 examine, investigate and make a complete study of Pennsylvania's 17 election laws, practices and procedures relating to voter 18 eligibility, to the methods of voting, to the casting, counting 19 and recounting of votes, to voter registration, to absentee 20 balloting, to protections against fraud and to legal remedies related thereto; and be it further 21

22 RESOLVED, That the committee consist of ten members of the 23 General Assembly as follows:

(1) Three members of the House of Representatives, one
of whom shall be a member of the minority party, shall be
appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

(2) Three members of the Senate, one of whom shall be a
member of the minority party, shall be appointed by the
President pro tempore of the Senate.

2 (4) The chairman and the minority chairman of the State
3 Government Committee of the Senate;

4 and be it further

5 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives 6 appoint a committee member from the House of Representatives as 7 a co-chairman of the committee and the President pro tempore of 8 the Senate shall appoint a committee member from the Senate as a 9 co-chairman of the committee; and be it further

10 RESOLVED, That the committee may hold hearings, take 11 testimony and conduct its investigations at such places in this Commonwealth as it deems necessary. It may issue subpoenas under 12 the hand and seal of the co-chairmen commanding any person to 13 14 appear before the committee and to answer questions touching 15 matters properly being inquired into by the committee and to 16 produce such books, papers, records and documents as the 17 committee deems necessary. The subpoenas may be served upon any 18 person and shall have the same effect as subpoenas issued out of 19 the courts of this Commonwealth and any person who willfully neglects or refuses to testify before the committee or to 20 21 produce any books, papers, records or documents shall be subject 22 to the penalties provided by the laws of this Commonwealth in 23 such case. Each member of the committee shall have power to administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses appearing before 24 the committee; and be it further 25

RESOLVED, That the committee be authorized to hire or contract for such staff as it deems necessary; and be it further RESOLVED, That the actual expenses incurred by the committee be equally divided between the House of Representatives and the Senate; and be it further

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1 RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings, together 2 with its recommendations for any remedial legislation or other 3 appropriate action, at the earliest practicable date, to the 4 House of Representatives and to the Senate, provided that the 5 committee is authorized to issue such interim reports as it 6 deems appropriate.
