A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating October 29, 2001, as "William H. Gray III Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, William H. Gray III was elected in 1978 to the
- 4 United States House of Representatives where he proudly served
- 5 as the Chairman of the Democratic Caucus and later as Majority
- 6 Whip; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Gray was a leading advocate for strengthening
- 8 America's educational systems and served as the Budget Committee
- 9 Chairman for four years, a monumental accomplishment as he was
- 10 the highest ranking African American to ever serve in the
- 11 Congress of the United States; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Mr. Gray distinguished himself as a consensus
- 13 builder, providing immeasurable wisdom to the Reagan
- 14 Administration as the principal intermediary in budget
- 15 negotiations between Congress and President Reagan and as an
- 16 assistant to the President in developing and carrying out policy
- 17 to restore democracy in Haiti; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Mr. Gray has been president and chief executive
- 2 officer of the United Negro College Fund, America's oldest and
- 3 most successful African-American education assistance
- 4 organization, for the last ten years; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Mr. Gray has pioneered the Fredrick D. Patterson
- 6 Research Institute and the Technology Enhancement Capital
- 7 Campaign; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Mr. Gray has an inclusive religious and educational
- 9 personal history, having served as a pastor of the 5,000-member
- 10 Bright Hope Baptist Church in Philadelphia for more than 20
- 11 years and as a faculty member and professor of history and
- 12 religion at St. Peter's College, Jersey City State College,
- 13 Montclair State College, Eastern Baptist Theological Seminary
- 14 and Temple University; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Mr. Gray has been recognized for his hard work and
- 16 dedication as a recipient of the prestigious Franklin Delano
- 17 Roosevelt Freedom of Worship Medal, the Medal of Honor from
- 18 Haitian President Jean-Bertrand Aristide in 1995 and more than
- 19 65 honorary degrees from America's leading colleges and
- 20 universities; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate October
- 22 29, 2001, as "William H. Gray III Day" in Pennsylvania.
