1 Honoring Red Hill Borough, Montgomery County, on the occasion of

3 WHEREAS, Red Hill Borough, Montgomery County, was
4 incorporated on November 13, 1902; and

5 WHEREAS, Like other emerging communities, Red Hill Borough
6 had a railroad station, village hotel and public school, and the
7 major industry was cigar making; and

8 WHEREAS, At the time of its incorporation, Red Hill Borough
9 had a population of 350 persons; and

10 WHEREAS, Currently more than 2,000 persons call Red Hill
11 Borough their home; and

12 WHEREAS, In 2002 Red Hill Borough celebrates the centennial
13 anniversary of its incorporation; therefore be it
