A RESOLUTION

- 1 Expressing support for the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 2 WHEREAS, The United States was founded on religious freedom
- 3 by founders, many of whom were deeply religious; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The First Amendment to the Constitution of the
- 5 United States embodies principles intended to guarantee freedom
- 6 of religion by conferring the free exercise of religion and by
- 7 prohibiting the government from establishing a religion; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Pledge of Allegiance was written by Francis
- 9 Bellamy, a Baptist minister, and first published in the
- 10 September 8, 1892, issue of The Youth's Companion; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States in 1954 added the
- 12 words "under God" to the Pledge of Allegiance; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Pledge of Allegiance has for almost 50 years
- 14 included references to the United States flag, to our country
- 15 having been established as a union "under God" and to our
- 16 country having been dedicated to securing "liberty and justice
- 17 for all"; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of
- 2 Pennsylvania believes that the Pledge of Allegiance is not an
- 3 unconstitutional expression; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Patriotic songs, engravings on United States legal
- 5 tender, and engravings on state buildings also contain general
- 6 references to "God"; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In accordance with decisions of the United States
- 8 Supreme Court, public school students cannot be forced to recite
- 9 the Pledge of Allegiance without violating their First Amendment
- 10 rights; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 12 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Congress to defend
- 13 the constitutionality of the Pledge of Allegiance by passing a
- 14 constitutional amendment to allow the Pledge of Allegiance to be
- 15 recited at all public events and in all public institutions.
