- 19 (B) EXCEPTIONS.--THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL NOT
- 20 APPLY TO RESEARCH OR VETERINARIAN SERVICES, INCLUDING
- 21 IMMUNIZATIONS, VACCINATIONS OR OTHER TREATMENTS ADMINISTERED
- 22 DURING THE NORMAL SCOPE OF PRACTICE.
