## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
  2 Statutes, providing for persons ineligible for licensing and
  3 for the learner's permit fee.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 1503 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 1503. Persons ineligible for licensing; license issuance to
- 9 minors; junior driver's license.
- 10 (a) Persons ineligible for licensing. -- The department shall
- 11 not issue a driver's license to, or renew the driver's license
- 12 of, any person:
- 13 (1) Whose operating privilege is suspended or revoked in
- this or any other state.
- 15 (3) Who is a user of alcohol or any controlled substance
- to a degree rendering the user incapable of safely driving a
- 17 motor vehicle. This paragraph does not apply to any person
- 18 who is enrolled or otherwise participating in a methadone or

- 1 other controlled substance treatment program approved by the
- 2 Department of Health provided that the person is certified to
- 3 be competent to drive by a physician designated by the
- 4 Department of Health.
- 5 (4) Who has been adjudged to be afflicted with or
- 6 suffering from any mental disability or disease and who has
- 7 not at the time of application been restored to competency by
- 8 the methods provided by law.
- 9 (5) Whose name has been submitted under the provisions
- of section 1518 (relating to reports on mental or physical
- disabilities or disorders).
- 12 (6) Who is required by the department to take an
- examination until the person has successfully passed the
- 14 examination.
- 15 (7) Who is under [18] <u>21</u> years of age except in
- accordance with subsections (b) and (c).
- 17 (8) Who has repeatedly violated any of the provisions of
- this chapter. The department shall provide an opportunity for
- 19 a hearing upon invoking this paragraph.
- 20 (b) License issuance to minors. -- The department shall issue
- 21 a driver's license to a person 17 years of age who:
- 22 (1) has successfully completed a driver's training
- course approved by the department; and
- 24 (2) for a period of 12 months after passing the
- examination under section 1505(e) (relating to learners'
- 26 permits) and receiving a junior driver's license:
- 27 (i) has not been involved in an accident reportable
- under section 3746(a) (relating to immediate notice of
- 29 accident to police department) for which they are
- 30 partially or fully responsible in the opinion of the

- 1 department; or
- 2 (ii) has not been convicted of any violation of this
- 3 title.
- 4 (c) Junior driver's license. -- The department may issue a
- 5 junior driver's license to a person 16 or 17 years of age under
- 6 rules and regulations adopted by the department and subject to
- 7 the provisions of this section. A junior driver's license shall
- 8 automatically become a regular driver's license when the junior
- 9 driver attains [18] <u>21</u> years of age.
- 10 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), no licensed
- junior driver shall drive a vehicle upon a public highway
- between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. unless accompanied by a spouse
- [18] <u>21</u> years of age or older, a parent or a person in loco
- 14 parentis.
- 15 (2) A licensed junior driver conforming to the
- requirements of section 1507 (relating to application for
- driver's license or learner's permit by minor) may drive a
- 18 vehicle upon a public highway between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.
- 19 between the junior driver's home and activity or employment
- or in the course of the junior driver's activity or
- 21 employment if the junior driver is a member of a volunteer
- 22 fire company authorized by the fire chief to engage in
- fighting fires, is engaged in public or charitable service or
- is employed and is carrying an affidavit or certificate of
- authorization signed by the junior driver's fire chief,
- 26 supervisor or employer indicating the probable schedule of
- 27 the junior driver's activities. Upon termination of the
- 28 junior driver's activity or employment, the junior driver
- 29 shall surrender the affidavit or certificate to the fire
- 30 chief, supervisor or employer. If the junior driver shall

- fail to surrender the affidavit or certificate, the employer,
- 2 fire chief or supervisor shall immediately notify the
- 3 Pennsylvania State Police.
- 4 (3) In addition to the other provisions of this title
- 5 relating to the suspension or revocation of operating
- 6 privileges, in the event that a licensed junior driver is
- 7 involved in an accident reportable under section 3746(a) for
- 8 which the junior driver is partially or fully responsible in
- 9 the opinion of the department or is convicted of any
- 10 violation of this title, the department may suspend the
- operating privileges of the junior driver until the junior
- driver attains [18] <u>21</u> years of age or for a period of time
- 13 not exceeding 90 days.
- 14 (4) Any junior driver or other person violating any
- provision of this subsection is guilty of a summary offense.
- 16 Section 2. Section 1951 of Title 75 is amended to read:
- 17 § 1951. Driver's license and learner's permit.
- 18 (a) Driver's license.--The annual fee for a driver's license
- 19 shall be \$5 plus the cost of the photograph required in section
- 20 1510(a) (relating to issuance and content of driver's license).
- 21 (b) Learner's permit. -- The fee for a learner's permit shall
- 22 be [\$5.] \$50. Fees collected under this subsection shall be
- 23 <u>allocated annually to the Department of Education in support of</u>
- 24 <u>standardized driver education programs as established in section</u>
- 25 2504.1 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as
- 26 <u>the Public School Code of 1949.</u>
- 27 (c) Identification card. -- The fee for an identification card
- 28 shall be \$5 plus the cost of the photograph.
- 29 (d) Replacement license or card. -- The fee for a replacement
- 30 driver's license or identification card shall be \$5 plus the

- 1 cost of the photograph.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
