AN ACT

- 1 Requiring procedures for the administration of medications to certain residents of long-term care facilities; imposing
- additional powers and duties on the Department of Aging, the
- 4 Department of Health and the Department of Public Welfare;
- 5 and further providing for licensing.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Short title.
- 9 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Long-Term
- 10 Care Facility Medication Safety Act.
- 11 Section 2. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Chronic dementia." An irreversible global loss of cognitive
- 16 function:
- 17 (1) Causing evident intellectual impairment, including

- 1 memory loss, without alteration of state of consciousness as
- 2 diagnosed by a physician.
- 3 (2) Severe enough to interfere with work or social
- 4 activities, or both.
- 5 (3) Requiring continuous care or supervision.
- 6 The term includes, but is not limited to, Alzheimer's disease.
- 7 "Facility." Any of the following:
- 8 (1) A home that provides domiciliary care as defined in
- 9 section 2202-A of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175),
- 10 known as The Administrative Code of 1929.
- 11 (2) A long-term care nursing facility as defined in
- 12 section 802.1 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48),
- 13 known as the Health Care Facilities Act.
- 14 (3) An older adult daily living center as defined in
- 15 section 2 of the act of July 11, 1990 (P.L.499, No.118),
- 16 known as the Older Adult Daily Living Centers Licensing Act.
- 17 (4) A personal care home as defined in section 1001 of
- the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public
- 19 Welfare Code.
- 20 "Licensing agency." In the case of:
- 21 (1) A domiciliary care home, the Department of Aging.
- 22 (2) A long-term care nursing facility, the Department of
- Health.
- 24 (3) An older adult daily living center, the Department
- of Aging.
- 26 (4) A personal care home, the Department of Public
- Welfare.
- 28 "Resident." A person who receives services in a facility.
- 29 Section 3. Administration of medications to residents with
- 30 chronic dementia.

- 1 (a) General rule.--A facility that advertises that it offers
- 2 specialized support services to residents with chronic dementia
- 3 shall adopt and implement procedures to assist those residents
- 4 with the administration of medications prescribed for self-
- 5 administration.
- 6 (b) Supplement to existing law.--The procedures required by
- 7 subsection (a) shall be in addition to any rules, regulations or
- 8 standards that exist on the effective date of this act relating
- 9 to the administration of medications.
- 10 Section 4. Enforcement.
- 11 The appropriate licensing agency shall ensure that a facility
- 12 complies with the provisions of this act as a condition of
- 13 licensure.
- 14 Section 5. Effective date.
- 15 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
