INTRODUCED BY B. SMITH AND STABACK, NOVEMBER 18, 2003

## AN ACT

Amending Title 30 (Fish) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for classes of fishing licenses, permits related to fishing, fishing license fees and boat registration fees.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Title 30 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
§ 2701.1. Junior fishing license.
(a) General rule.--A person is eligible for a "Junior

Fishing License" issued under this chapter when the person:
(1) Is less than 16 years of age.
(2) Has applied to an issuing agent within this

Commonwealth or to the commission.
(3) Has established the person's identity and age to the
satisfaction of the issuing agent or the commission.
(4) Has paid the issuing agent or the commission a
license fee and issuing agent fee as set forth in section
2715 (relating to license, permit and issuing agent fees).
(b) Permits.--The holder of a Junior Fishing License issued under this section shall not be required to obtain a trout/salmon permit to fish for trout or salmon or a special permit to fish in Lake Erie and tributaries.

Section 2. Section $2702(a)$ of Title 30 is amended to read: § 2702. Nonresident and tourist licenses.
(a) Nonresident annual licenses.--For the purposes of this chapter, any person who does not purchase a resident fishing license under section 2701 (relating to resident fishing licenses) is eligible for a "Nonresident Annual Fishing License" when the person:
(1) Has applied to an issuing agent or to the commission.
(2) Has paid the issuing agent or the commission a license fee and issuing agent fee set forth in section 2715 (relating to license, permit and issuing agent fees). * * *

Section 3. Title 30 is amended by adding a section to read: § 2702.1. One-day fishing license.
(a) General rule.--A person required to have a fishing license under section 2701 (relating to resident fishing licenses) or 2701.1 (relating to junior fishing license) may fish in any waters of this Commonwealth or in any boundary waters for a period not to exceed one calendar day (12:01 a.m. to midnight) with a "One-Day Fishing License" upon payment of a license fee and issuing agent fee set forth in section 2715 (relating to license, permit and issuing agent fees).
(b) Limitation on issue.--One-Day Fishing Licenses shall not be issued for fishing during the period from April 1 to April 30 of any year.
Day Fishing Licenses shall obtain all required special permits,
including trout/salmon permits to fish for trout or salmon and
special permits to fish in Lake Erie and tributaries.

Section 4. Sections 2703(a), 2715, 2904(b) and 2907.2 of Title 30 are amended to read:
§ 2703. Possession and display of licenses.
(a) General rule.--No person [16] 12 years of age or older shall fish in any of the waters of this Commonwealth or in any boundary waters without first procuring the proper license required by this chapter. The license shall be kept about the person while fishing and shown upon the request of any waterways [patrolman] conservation officer or other officer designated by the commission. In addition to showing the license to the officer, the holder thereof shall, upon demand, establish his further identity to the satisfaction of the officer by producing some other positive means of identification. The commission may promulgate rules and regulations for the displaying of the license certificate, license button or other device, as it deems necessary.

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§ 2715. License, permit and issuing agent fees.
(a) License fees.--The following fees apply to fishing licenses issued under this chapter and shall be paid into the Fish Fund:
(1) Resident Annual Fishing License, [\$16.25] \$20.
(2) Senior Resident Annual Fishing License, [\$3.25] \$10.
(3) Senior Resident Lifetime Fishing License, [\$15.25] $\$ 50$.
(4) Nonresident Annual Fishing License, [\$34.25] \$50.
into a restricted account within the Fish Fund, which account shall be used for paying recompense to holders of gill net licenses for boundary lakes as provided in section 2903(h) (relating to gill nets) and for the costs of administering the recompense and special permit programs. The holders of gill net licenses shall have until July 10, 2002, and no later to accept the recompense payment calculated as provided in section 2903(h). The balance in the restricted account shall be used to acquire property and to provide public fishing access on or at Lake Erie, its tributaries and Presque Isle Bay.
(g) Termination of permit requirement.--The special permit program established by this section shall terminate when the commission determines that sufficient funds have been raised to defray the recompense and special permit program costs, provided that in no event shall special permits be required on or after January 1, 2001.]
(h) Accounting.--The commission shall provide an annual accounting of the permit program to the Committee on Game and Fisheries in the Senate and the Committee on Game and Fisheries in the House of Representatives.

Section 5. Title 30 is amended by adding a section to read: \$ 2907.3. Fishing guide and charter boat permits.
(a) General rule.--It is unlawful for any person to operate a charter boat or fishing guide operation on the waters of this Commonwealth without first obtaining a charter boat/fishing guide permit from the commission and paying the fee specified in section 2715 (relating to license, permit and issuing agent fees).
(b) Issuing agent status.--Holders of charter boat/fishing guide permits may be designated as special issuing agents for
(a) General rule.--The following fees apply to registrations, licenses, permits and capacity plates and certificates issued under this part and the fees collected shall be deposited in the State Treasury in the Boat Fund:
(1) Owner registration (motorboats less than 16 feet in length), [\$10] \$13 per year.
(2) Owner registration (motorboats 16 feet to less than 20 feet), [\$15] \$19.50 per year.
(2.1) Owner registration (motorboats 20 feet [or longer), $\$ 20$ per year.] to less than 40 feet), $\$ 26$ per year.
[(2.2) Owner registration (boats not equipped with motors), \$5 per year.]
(2.2) Owner registration (motorboats 40 feet to less than 65 feet), $\$ 26$ per year.
(2.3) Owner registration (motorboats 65 feet or longer). $\$ 26$ per year.
(2.4) Owner registration (boats not equipped with motors), $\$ 9$ per year or as fixed under subsection (b).
(3) Duplicate owner registration, \$3 each.
(4) Dealer registration, $\$ 15$ each per year.
(5) Commercial passenger boat registration, $\$ 25$ each.
(6) License for operator of passenger-carrying boat, \$5 each.
(7) Capacity plate, \$5 each.
(8) Transfer of a multi-year boat registration, \$5.
(9) Permit for floating structure and private aids to navigation, $\$ 10$ each.
(10) Boating safety education certificate, $\$ 10$.
(11) Replacement boating safety education certificate, \$5.
(b) Fee adjustment for nonpowered boats.--The fee for owner registration for boats not equipped with motors specified in subsection (a)(2.4) shall be adjusted from time to time to remain equal to the fees charged by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for boat launch permits for State park lakes.

Section 7. This act shall apply as follows:
(1) The fees provided in 30 Pa.C.S. § 2715 shall be applicable to the license year beginning after December 31, 2003, and thereafter and shall be collected starting on the first day of the first month beginning 30 days after the effective date set forth in section 8(4).
(2) The permit fees under 30 Pa.C.S. § 2907.3 shall not be collected for a period of 60 days following the effective date of regulations promulgated under 30 Pa.C.S. § 2907.3. Section 8. This act shall take effect as follows:
(1) The amendment or addition of 30 Pa.C.S. §§ 2701.1, 2702.1 and 2907.2 shall take effect July 1, 2004 , or 90 days after the effective date of this act as provided in paragraph (4), whichever is later.
(2) The addition of 30 Pa.C.S. § 2907.3 shall take effect immediately.
(3) The amendment of 30 Pa.C.S. § 5104 shall take effect April 1, 2004, or 60 days after the effective date of this act as provided in paragraph (4), whichever is later.
(4) The remainder of this act shall take effect immediately.
