AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, providing for special plates for children of United
- 3 States Marines killed in combat; and establishing the Marine
- 4 Corps Scholarship Fund.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 1361. Special plates for children of United States Marines
- 10 killed in combat.
- 11 (a) Authorization.--Upon application of any person who is a
- 12 child of a member of the United States Marine Corps, which
- 13 member was killed in combat, accompanied by a fee of \$20 in
- 14 addition to the annual registration fee and by such
- 15 documentation as the department shall require, the department

- 1 shall issue to the person a special registration plate
- 2 <u>designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a child of a</u>
- 3 <u>United States Marine killed in combat and that displays the</u>
- 4 United States Marine Corps emblem. The special registration
- 5 plate may be used only on a passenger car or truck with a
- 6 registered gross weight of not more than 9,000 pounds.
- 7 (b) Marine Corps Scholarship Fund.--
- 8 (1) Moneys from the issuance of the plate authorized by
- 9 <u>this section shall be deposited into the Marine Corps</u>
- Scholarship Fund, which fund is established as a special fund
- in the State Treasury. All moneys in the fund shall be used
- by the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation, Inc., a
- recognized charitable organization that meets the
- requirements of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue
- 15 <u>Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)), to</u>
- 16 provide grants for scholarships for higher education.
- 17 (2) The scholarship recipients must be the children of
- 18 United States Marine Corps personnel who were killed in
- 19 combat and who meet the academic, financial and other
- 20 <u>requirements established by the Marine Corps Scholarship</u>
- 21 Foundation, Inc.
- 22 (3) The scholarship recipients must be residents of this
- 23 Commonwealth and attend a college or university located
- within this Commonwealth.
- 25 (4) The State Treasurer shall require the Marine Corps
- 26 <u>Scholarship Foundation, Inc., to establish a separate account</u>
- for receipt of the proceeds of the fund. That account shall
- 28 <u>be subject to audit either annually or at another interval,</u>
- 29 <u>as determined by the State Treasurer. Proceeds from the fund</u>
- 30 shall be transferred on a quarterly basis by the State

- 1 Treasurer's office to the separate account.
- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
