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17	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
18	hereby enacts as follows:
19	PART I
20	GENERAL PROVISIONS
21	Section 101. Short titleThis act shall be known and may
22	be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 2004.
23	Section 102. DefinitionsThe following words and phrases
24	when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in
25	this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
26	"Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
27	or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
28	superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
29	engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
30	auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
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marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
 other assistants in any department, board or commission.

3 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding 4 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, 5 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and 6 7 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, 8 9 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, 10 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and 11 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of 12 13 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment 14 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on 15 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee 16 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth 17 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation 18 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or 19 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental 20 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of 21 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of 22 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned 23 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred 24 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall 25 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State 26 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside 27 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution 28 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State 29 medical assistance program.

State appropriations.--(a) General Fund.--The 4 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 5 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the 6 7 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 8 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 9 10 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 11 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public 12 13 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and 14 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by 15 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the 16 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 17 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 18 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 19 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004. 20 (b) State Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in 21 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby

22 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the 23 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department 24 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 25 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 26 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 27 28 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 29 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 30 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 20040H2579B3853 - 11 -

 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid

4 (c) Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund. -- The following 5 sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Energy 6 7 Conservation and Assistance Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth 8 9 for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for 10 the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment 11 of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, 12 necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and 13 activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the 14 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of bills 15 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 16 ending June 30, 2004.

17 (d) Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account.--The 18 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 19 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 20 restricted receipt account established within the General Fund, 21 known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to 22 the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of 23 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses, for 24 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 25 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 26 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 27 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 28 29 beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred 30 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 20040H2579B3853 - 12 -

Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The 2 (e) 3 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 4 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 5 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 6 7 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 8 9 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by 10 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, 11 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and for the 12 13 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 14 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

15 (f) The State Stores Fund.--The following sums set forth in 16 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 17 specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the 18 hereinafter named agency of the Executive Department of the 19 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 20 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 21 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 22 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 23 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 24 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 25 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 26 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 27 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 28 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

29 (g) Motor License Fund.--The following sums, or as much 30 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the 20040H2579B3853 - 13 -

Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 1 Executive Department for the payment of salaries, wages and 2 3 other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 4 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for 5 contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes 6 7 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 8 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004. 9

10 (h) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account. -- The following 11 sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the 12 13 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 14 Executive Department for the purposes set forth herein for the 15 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of bills 16 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004. 17

18 (i) Hazardous Material Response Fund. -- The following sums 19 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, 20 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Hazardous Material 21 Response Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the 22 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees 23 for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 24 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 25 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 26 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 27 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 28 29 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

30 (j) Milk Marketing Fund.--The following sums set forth in 20040H2579B3853 - 14 -

this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 1 2 specifically appropriated from the Milk Marketing Fund to the 3 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department 4 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 5 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 6 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 7 8 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 9 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 10 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 11 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 12 13 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

14 (k) Home Investment Trust Fund. -- The following sums set 15 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 16 hereby specifically appropriated from the Home Investment Trust 17 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 18 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, 19 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 20 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 21 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 22 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 23 24 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 25 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 26 beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred 27 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 28 30, 2004.

29 (1) Tuition Payment Fund.--The following sums set forth in 30 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 20040H2579B3853 - 15 -

specifically appropriated from the Tuition Payment Fund to the 1 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 2 3 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 4 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 5 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 6 7 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 8 9 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 10 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 11 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 12 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

13 Banking Department Fund. -- The following sums set forth (m) 14 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 15 specifically appropriated from the Banking Department Fund to 16 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of 17 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 18 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 19 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 20 21 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 22 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 23 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 24 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 25 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 26 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

27 (n) Firearm Records Check Fund.--The following sums set 28 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 29 hereby specifically appropriated from the Firearm Records Check 30 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 20040H2579B3853 - 16 -

Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, 1 2 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 3 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 4 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 5 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 6 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 7 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 8 9 beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred 10 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 11 30, 2004.

(o) Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund. -- The 12 13 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 14 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Ben 15 Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund to the 16 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 17 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 18 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 19 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 20 21 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 22 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 23 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 24 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 25 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 26 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

(p) Tobacco Settlement Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of 20040H2579B3853 - 17 -

the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 1 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 2 3 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 4 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 5 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 6 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 7 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 8 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 9 10 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

11 (q) Health Care Provider Retention Account. -- The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 12 13 appropriated from the Health Care Provider Retention Account in the General Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 14 15 Executive Department for the purposes set forth herein for the 16 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 17 18 ending June 30, 2004.

19 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations. -- The 20 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this 21 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 22 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to 23 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 24 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses 25 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for 26 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and for the payment of 27 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004. Unless otherwise stated, the 28 29 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal 30 year.

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Section 106. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004.

8 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small 9 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small 10 cities and communities that have a high concentration of 11 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their 12 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet 13 community development needs.

14 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services 15 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and 16 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on 17 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the 18 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 19 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old 20 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements 21 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to 22 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The
Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
for the provision of preventive health and other health services
related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
violence services.

30 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The 20040H2579B3853 - 19 - 1 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to 2 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in 3 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for 4 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with 5 special health care needs, and in providing health services for 6 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health 7 care.

8 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. -- The Low-9 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help 10 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income 11 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds 12 13 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds 14 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds 15 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement. Unexpended weatherization funds which would result in LIHEABG funds being 16 17 returned to the Federal Department of Health and Human Services 18 may be spent for assistance grants at the discretion of the 19 Secretary of the Budget. The Secretary of the Budget shall 20 notify the chairman and the minority chairman of the 21 Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman and the 22 minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives of the intent to reallocate any such funds 23 24 ten days prior to any reallocation.

(g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible persons.

(h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health
 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of
 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with
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1 serious emotional disturbance.

2 (i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
3 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
4 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

5 (j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child 6 Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the 7 provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and 8 availability of child care for low-income families.

9 (k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.--10 The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG) 11 provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care, 12 training and support services, child welfare and administration 13 for eligible families and individuals.

SECTION 107. ADMINISTRATIVE COST REDUCTION PLANS.--BY AUGUST <-
1 EACH STATE AGENCY SHALL SUBMIT A PLAN TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE
GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON HOW TO REDUCE ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS OF THE
AGENCY BY 5%. THE GOVERNOR SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO ACCEPT,
MODIFY OR REJECT EACH PLAN FOR AGENCIES UNDER THE GOVERNOR'S
JURISDICTION.
