A RESOLUTION

Memorializing the Congress of the United States to increase 1 2 funding for research to find a cure for type 1 diabetes. 3 WHEREAS, There are more than 16 million Americans affected by diabetes and the World Health Organization estimates that number 4 5 will nearly double to 30 million by 2025; and WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention 6 7 refers to diabetes as the "epidemic of our time"; and 8 WHEREAS, Diabetes is the fourth leading cause of death, killing more than 162,000 people each year; and 9 10 WHEREAS, There are 800,000 new cases of insulin-dependent diabetes diagnosed in the United States each year, and of those 11 12 cases, approximately 10% are children 18 years of age and 13 younger who are diagnosed with type 1 diabetes; and WHEREAS, The incidence of type 1 diabetes is increasing most 14 rapidly in children younger than six years of age; and 15

WHEREAS, Diabetes is the leading cause of disability and
 reduces life expectancy by 30% while life expectancy has
 increased for other diseases such as cardiovascular disease and
 stroke; and

5 WHEREAS, Children and young adults with type 1 diabetes face 6 a lifetime of daily insulin injections and the possibility of 7 early complications whose severity will likely increase with 8 duration; and

9 WHEREAS, In the United States alone diabetes costs \$138
10 billion annually, which represents one out of every \$7 spent on
11 health care; and

12 WHEREAS, The current Federal budget for diabetes research 13 represents less than one-half of 1% of the annual cost of 14 diabetes to the United States economy; and

15 WHEREAS, If 1ç of every dollar spent per year on diabetes 16 were donated to the effort to fund a cure, the diabetes research 17 budget would grow by \$1.5 billion; and

18 WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States created the 19 Diabetes Research Working Group (DRWG), which is the first 20 congressional research group to focus on a specific disease and 21 to be charged with developing a plan to identify the research 22 needed to prevent and cure diabetes; and

23 WHEREAS, DRWG has developed a comprehensive and important 24 plan that identifies unmet research opportunities and has 25 unanimously concluded that the current funding level is far 26 short of what is required to make progress on this complex and 27 difficult problem; and

28 WHEREAS, Improvements in technology and the general growth in 29 scientific knowledge offer unprecedented opportunities for 30 advances that might lead to better treatments, prevention and 20030H0078R0409 - 2 - 1 possibly a cure; and

2 WHEREAS, Many scientific opportunities are not being pursued 3 due to insufficient funding, lack of appropriate mechanisms and a shortage of trained researchers; therefore be it 4 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize Congress to increase 6 funding for research to find a cure for type 1 diabetes, which 7 affects 2 million children in the United States; and be it 8 further 9

10 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to 11 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each 12 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.

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
