A RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing the Congress of the United States to refuse to reorganize the Head Start program.
- 3 WHEREAS, Head Start provides a comprehensive program,
- 4 including activities to promote social, emotional, cognitive and
- 5 physical development as well as health services, for children in
- 6 poverty; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Head Start in Pennsylvania also provides case
- 8 management services as well as general educational development,
- 9 job training, job placement and parenting classes for families
- 10 that live well below the Federal poverty level; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Head Start has provided necessary services to more
- 12 than 20 million children and families since its creation in
- 13 1965; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania had more than 30,940 children
- 15 participating in various Head Start activities in 2002, with an
- 16 estimated Federal appropriation of \$220 million; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The underlying law for Head Start needs to be
- 2 reauthorized before October 1, 2003; and
- 3 WHEREAS, It has been proposed in Washington, D.C., that as a
- 4 part of this reauthorization, Head Start should be relocated
- 5 from its current agency to the Department of Education; and
- 6 WHEREAS, It has been proposed that Head Start would change
- 7 from a program which supplies Federal grants directly to
- 8 community organizations to a state-controlled program; and
- 9 WHEREAS, It has been proposed to eliminate the performance
- 10 standards that are a fundamental part of the Head Start's
- 11 success; and
- 12 WHEREAS, All of these proposed changes would drastically
- 13 alter and threaten the success of Head Start in Pennsylvania;
- 14 therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 16 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Congress of the
- 17 United States to oppose efforts to relocate Head Start to the
- 18 Department of Education, to oppose efforts to convert Head Start
- 19 into a block grant program without performance standards and to
- 20 reject efforts to minimize Federal responsibility and
- 21 accountability and efforts to permit future budget cuts in Head
- 22 Start; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives send
- 24 a copy of this resolution to the Pennsylvania Congressional
- 25 delegation and the President of the United States.
