AN ACT

1 2 3	Providing for the creation of a model domestic abuse awareness and assistance program and for related powers and duties of the Department of Labor and Industry.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
б	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Domestic
8	Abuse Assistance and Awareness in the Workplace Act.
9	Section 2. Legislative findings and declarations.
10	The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
11	(1) There is an ever-increasing number of persons in
12	this Commonwealth who are affected by domestic abuse. Studies
13	have indicated that, nationally, one in three women is a
14	victim of domestic abuse. Domestic abuse not only causes
15	physical injury but also loss of trust, loss of personal
16	safety in one's own home, loss of self-esteem and loss of
17	control over one's own life. Domestic abuse can also extend
18	into the workplace by leading to lost wages, higher health

care costs, lower productivity, excessive absenteeism and
 increased security needs.

3 (2) Domestic abuse directly affects workplaces when 4 batterers attack, stalk or harass women at work. Nationally, 5 94% of corporate security directors surveyed rank domestic 6 abuse as a high security problem. It has been estimated that the total medical cost of domestic abuse in Pennsylvania 7 8 exceeds the medical cost of elder abuse, child abuse and 9 street violence combined. Employers throughout this 10 Commonwealth can and should take steps to make workplaces safer for employees who are victims of domestic abuse. 11 12 Appropriate workplace programs relating to domestic abuse 13 benefit both the victims and their employers by promoting support and safety. 14

15 (3) It is the intent of the General Assembly to reaffirm 16 the Commonwealth's commitment to victims of domestic abuse by 17 providing awareness and assistance to employers and employees 18 in the workplace.

19 Section 3. Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

23 "Department." The Department of Labor and Industry of the24 Commonwealth.

25 "Domestic abuse." The occurrence of one or more of the 26 following acts between family or household members, sexual or 27 intimate partners or persons who share biological parenthood:

(1) Attempting to cause or intentionally, knowingly or
 recklessly causing bodily injury, serious bodily injury,
 rape, involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, sexual assault,
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statutory sexual assault, aggravated indecent assault,
 indecent assault or incest with or without a deadly weapon.

3 (2) Placing another in reasonable fear of imminent4 serious bodily injury.

5 (3) Inflicting false imprisonment pursuant to 18 Pa.C.S.
6 § 2903 (relating to false imprisonment).

7 (4) Physically or sexually abusing minor children,
8 including such terms as defined in 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63
9 (relating to child protective services).

10 (5) Knowingly engaging in a course of conduct or 11 repeatedly committing acts toward another person, including 12 following the person, without proper authority, under 13 circumstances which place the person in reasonable fear of 14 bodily injury.

15 "Family or household members." Spouses or persons who have 16 been spouses, persons living as spouses or who lived as spouses, 17 parents and children, other persons related by consanguinity or 18 affinity, current or former sexual or intimate partners or 19 persons who share biological parenthood.

20 "Secretary." The Secretary of Labor and Industry of the 21 Commonwealth.

22 "Victim." A victim of domestic abuse.

23 Section 4. Powers and duties.

The secretary shall, in consultation with the Physician General of the Commonwealth, the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Domestic Violence, the Pennsylvania State Police and any other entities deemed necessary, develop a model domestic abuse awareness and assistance program for use by employers throughout this Commonwealth.

30 Section 5. Program goal and availability.

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1 The program shall be directed at:

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2 (1) educating employers and employees in the workplace 3 to recognize the signs and effects of domestic abuse; (2) providing training to security personnel about how 4 5 to handle crimes committed in or around the workplace by perpetrators of abuse; and 6 7 (3) offering support and safety to victims while in the 8 workplace. The program shall be made available by the department upon 9 request of employers in this Commonwealth. 10 11 Section 6. Regulations. 12 The department shall promulgate regulations to implement this 13 act. Section 7. Effective date. 14

This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
