AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled 1 2 "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, 3 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, primary and election expenses and election contests; creating 4 5 and defining membership of county boards of elections; 6 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, 7 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, 8 9 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and 10 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 11 elections," further providing for reporting by candidate and 12 political committees and other persons.

13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

14 hereby enacts as follows:

15 Section 1. Section 1626(a), (b)(1) and (i) of the act of

16 June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania

17 Election Code, added October 4, 1978 (P.L.893, No.171) and July

18 21, 1979 (P.L.189, No.63), are amended to read:

19 Section 1626. Reporting by Candidate and Political

20 Committees and other Persons.--

21 (a) Each treasurer of a political committee and each

candidate for election to public office shall file with the 1 appropriate supervisor reports of receipts and expenditures on 2 3 forms, designed by the Secretary of the Commonwealth, if the 4 amount received or expended or liabilities incurred shall exceed 5 the sum of [two hundred fifty dollars (\$250)] five hundred dollars (\$500). Should such an amount not exceed [two hundred 6 fifty dollars (\$250)] five hundred dollars (\$500), then the 7 8 candidate or the treasurer of the committee shall file a sworn statement to that effect with the appropriate supervisor rather 9 10 than the report required by this section.

11 Each report shall include the following information: (b) The full name, mailing address, occupation and name of 12 (1)13 employer, if any, or the principal place of business, if self-14 employed, of each person who has made one or more contributions 15 to or for such committee or candidate within the reporting 16 period in an aggregate amount or value in excess of [two hundred 17 fifty dollars (\$250)] <u>five hundred dollars (\$500)</u>, together with 18 the amount and date of such contributions. The accuracy of the 19 information furnished to the candidate or committee shall be the 20 responsibility of the contributor.

21 * * *

22 (i) An expenditure from a candidate's political committee to 23 another political committee shall be reported as a contribution 24 by the political committee receiving the contribution but need 25 not be reported by the contributing candidate's political 26 committee until the time required by law for that candidate's 27 political committee to report: Provided, however, That if the 28 amount of the contribution exceeds [two hundred fifty dollars (\$250)] five hundred dollars (\$500) to a single political 29 30 committee or one thousand dollars (\$1,000) in aggregate 20050H0491B0530 - 2 -

contributions to more than one political committee for any
primary, general or special election, then receipts and
expenditures shall be reported by the contributing committee at
the same time as required by law for the committee receiving
same.

- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
