AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for exemption from payment
- 3 of real estate taxes by certain surviving spouses.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 8902 of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 8902. Exemption.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- Any citizen or resident of this
- 10 Commonwealth shall be exempt from the payment of all real estate
- 11 taxes levied upon any building, including the land upon which it
- 12 stands, occupied by that person as a principal dwelling, if [all
- 13 of] the following requirements are met:
- 14 (1) (i) That person has been honorably discharged
- or released under honorable circumstances from the armed

- forces of the United States for service in any war or armed conflict in which this nation was engaged.
- 3 [(2)] <u>(ii)</u> As a result of such military service,
- 4 that person is blind or paraplegic or has sustained the
- loss of two or more limbs, or has a service-connected
- disability declared by the United States Veterans'
- 7 Administration or its successors to be a total or 100%
- 8 permanent disability.
- 9 [(3)] <u>(iii)</u> The dwelling is owned by that person
- solely or as an estate by the entirety[.]; or
- 11 [(4) The need for the exemption from the payment of real
- estate taxes has been determined by the State Veterans'
- 13 Commission.]
- 14 (2) That person was the spouse of a person who was
- 15 <u>killed while on active duty with a branch of the armed forces</u>
- of the United States in any war or armed conflict in which
- this nation was engaged.
- 18 (b) Extension of exemption. -- The exemption provided in
- 19 subsection [(a)] (a)(1) shall be extended to the unmarried
- 20 surviving spouse upon the death of the eligible veteran
- 21 [provided that the State Veterans' Commission determines that
- 22 such spouse is in need of an exemption].
- 23 Section 2. This act shall apply retroactively to January 1,
- 24 2003.
- 25 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
