## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 11, 1971 (P.L.104, No.3), entitled, as amended, "An act providing property tax or rent rebate and inflation dividends to certain senior citizens, widows, 3 4 widowers and permanently disabled persons with limited incomes; establishing uniform standards and qualifications 6 for eligibility to receive rebates and dividends; providing 7 for transportation assistance grants and grants to area agencies on aging for services to older persons; and imposing 8 duties upon the Department of Revenue, "further defining 10 "income"; and providing a definition for "Social Security 11 substitute pension."
- 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 13 hereby enacts as follows:
- 14 Section 1. Section 3(1) of the act of March 11, 1971
- 15 (P.L.104, No.3), known as the Senior Citizens Rebate and
- 16 Assistance Act, reenacted and amended December 21, 1979
- 17 (P.L.570, No.131) and amended June 25, 1999 (P.L.226, No.30), is
- 18 amended and the section is amended by adding a definition to

- 1 read:
- 2 Section 3. Definitions.--As used in this act:
- 3 (1) "Income" means all income from whatever source derived,
- 4 including but not limited to salaries, wages, bonuses,
- 5 commissions, income from self-employment, alimony, support
- 6 money, cash public assistance and relief, the gross amount of
- 7 any pensions or annuities including railroad retirement benefits
- 8 for calendar years prior to 1999, and fifty per cent of railroad
- 9 retirement benefits for calendar years 1999 [and thereafter]
- 10 through 2002, all benefits received under the Federal Social
- 11 Security Act (except Medicare benefits) for calendar years prior
- 12 to 1999, and fifty per cent of all benefits received under the
- 13 Federal Social Security Act (except Medicare benefits) for
- 14 calendar years 1999 [and thereafter] through 2002, all benefits
- 15 received under State unemployment insurance laws and veterans'
- 16 disability payments, all interest received from the Federal or
- 17 any State government, or any instrumentality or political
- 18 subdivision thereof, realized capital gains, rentals, workmen's
- 19 compensation and the gross amount of loss of time insurance
- 20 benefits, life insurance benefits and proceeds (except the first
- 21 five thousand dollars (\$5,000) of the total of death benefit
- 22 payments), and gifts of cash or property (other than transfers
- 23 by gift between members of a household) in excess of a total
- 24 value of three hundred dollars (\$300), but shall not include
- 25 surplus food or other relief in kind supplied by a governmental
- 26 agency or property tax or rent rebate or inflation dividend. For
- 27 calendar years 2005 and thereafter, "income" shall not include:
- 28 fifty per cent of all benefits received under the Federal Social
- 29 <u>Security Act (except Medicare benefits) and fifty per cent of</u>
- 30 <u>any Social Security substitute pension.</u>

- 2 (10) "Social Security substitute pension" means a pension
- 3 <u>received as a result of a person's employment by a government</u>
- 4 entity or an instrumentality of a government entity if such
- 5 pension is, in whole or in part, provided in lieu of old age and
- 6 <u>survivors benefit payments under the Federal Social Security</u>
- 7 Act. The term includes Tier I railroad retirement benefits. The
- 8 amount of the pension that qualifies as a "Social Security
- 9 <u>substitute pension" shall not exceed the maximum Federal old age</u>
- 10 and survivors benefit payments to which an individual eliqible
- 11 for such payments would be entitled, less any Federal old age
- 12 and survivors benefit payments received under the Federal Social
- 13 <u>Security Act for employment covered under such act.</u>
- 14 Section 2. This act shall apply to claims filed for calendar
- 15 year 2005 and each year thereafter.
- 16 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
