## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for violence programs.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 9 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 10 section to read:
- 11 Section 1551. Violence Program. -- (a) Each public school
- 12 student shall receive mandatory instruction in prevention of
- 13 violence in society in general and in schools in particular in
- 14 every grade from kindergarten through grade twelve. The
- 15 instruction shall be integrated within the health course of
- 16 <u>study required in accordance with the State Board of Education</u>
- 17 regulations. In grades where health is offered, instruction may
- 18 also be integrated into other appropriate courses of study. In
- 19 grades where health is not offered, instruction shall be

- 1 <u>integrated into an appropriate curriculum requirement.</u>
- 2 (1) This instruction:
- 3 (i) Shall be age appropriate.
- 4 (ii) Shall be sequential in method of study.
- 5 (iii) Shall explain the causes of violence.
- 6 (iv) Shall espouse the rejection of violence in society in
- 7 general and in schools in particular.
- 8 (2) School districts may utilize any appropriate public or
- 9 private materials, personnel and other resources in developing
- 10 and implementing this program of instruction. The Pennsylvania
- 11 State Police shall make available information about appropriate
- 12 <u>curriculum materials upon request of a school district.</u>
- (b) Each school district is authorized to develop and offer
- 14 instruction and discussion relating to this program for parents
- 15 of students enrolled in the public schools.
- 16 (c) The Department of Education shall develop curriculum
- 17 guidelines for this program.
- 18 (d) The Department of Education shall make available to all
- 19 school districts and intermediate units in-service training
- 20 programs based upon the instruction requirements established in
- 21 subsection (a) and the curriculum guidelines established in
- 22 subsection (c).
- 23 (e) Each school district shall provide, as part of its in-
- 24 <u>service training, programs on violence for all instructors whose</u>
- 25 <u>teaching responsibilities include courses of study in which</u>
- 26 mandated instruction concerning violence is integrated. To
- 27 comply with this requirement, a school district may utilize the
- 28 programs made available by the Department of Education or use
- 29 <u>other alternative programs</u>.
- 30 (f) The governing board of each intermediate unit in which a

- 1 nonpublic school is located shall have the authority and the
- 2 <u>duty to loan to all students attending nonpublic schools within</u>
- 3 the intermediate unit all educational materials developed by the
- 4 Department of Education pursuant to this section. Local school
- 5 boards need not expend funds which are not provided by either
- 6 the Federal Government or State government for the use or loan
- 7 of these materials. A nonpublic school may utilize the in-
- 8 service training programs made available by the Department of
- 9 Education through the intermediate unit.
- 10 Section 2. The addition of section 1551 of the act shall
- 11 apply to school years which begin after the effective date of
- 12 this section.
- 13 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
