AN ACT

- 1 Establishing a program for obtaining information from
- 2 institutions of higher education in a uniform manner to
- 3 permit statistical comparison; and imposing additional powers
- 4 and duties on the Department of Education and institutions of
- 5 higher education.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Short title.
- 9 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Teacher
- 10 Assessment Report Card Act.
- 11 Section 2. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 16 Commonwealth.
- 17 "Institution of higher education." A public or private
- 18 college or university offering a teacher education program

- 1 approved by the Department of Education.
- 2 "Report card." The teacher assessment report card identified
- 3 in section 4 (relating to teacher assessment report card).
- 4 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 5 "Teacher assessment test for initial certification." The
- 6 assessment test as defined by 22 Pa. Code § 49.18(a)(2)(ii)

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- 7 (relating to assessment). ASSESSMENT TOOL IDENTIFIED BY THE
- 8 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO BE USED TO EVALUATE A CANDIDATE'S
- 9 PREPAREDNESS FOR INITIAL CERTIFICATION.
- 10 Section 3. Duties of institutions of higher education.
- 11 (a) General rule.--Each institution of higher education
- 12 shall complete a report card in accordance with this act and on
- 13 a uniform form prepared and furnished by the department.
- 14 (b) Time.--The report card form shall be completed by each
- 15 institution of higher education for each academic year and
- 16 forwarded to the department on a schedule to be established by
- 17 the secretary.
- 18 Section 4. Teacher assessment report card.
- 19 (a) General rule. -- The teacher assessment report card shall
- 20 contain information to assist teachers, students and the general
- 21 public in assessing, evaluating and comparing the quality of
- 22 education being provided to higher education students in
- 23 approved teacher education programs.
- 24 (b) Access to report cards. -- The secretary shall make use of
- 25 modern technology to assure wide access and distribution of the
- 26 information provided on the report cards and shall include such
- 27 information as the secretary in his discretion deems necessary
- 28 to assist the general public in assessing, evaluating, comparing
- 29 and understanding the quality of education being provided
- 30 students in institutions of higher education. STUDENTS ENROLLED

- 1 IN TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAMS AT INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER
- 2 EDUCATION.
- 3 (c) Contents. -- The report card form shall state that the
- 4 information is provided for the purpose of presenting an
- 5 overview of the applicable institution of higher education and
- 6 shall not be deemed to create a set of standards relating to the
- 7 quality of education being offered in that institution of higher
- 8 education and other institutions of higher education. This
- 9 information shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- 10 (1) Number of students enrolled in approved
- 11 postsecondary teacher education programs in an academic year.
- 12 (2) Number of students who applied or were accepted to
- 13 take the teacher assessment test for initial certification in
- 14 that academic year.
- 15 (3) Number of students who passed the teacher assessment
- 16 test for initial certification after the first attempt.
- 17 (4) Number of students who passed the teacher assessment
- 18 test for initial certification after multiple attempts.
- 19 (5) Average number of attempts taken in order to pass
- 20 the teacher assessment test for initial certification.
- 21 (6) Report of the teacher assessment test for initial
- 22 certification results by the individual licensure area.
- 23 SUBJECT MATTER OR CONTENT AREA TESTED. THIS REPORT SHALL BE
- 24 LIMITED TO THOSE SUBJECT MATTER AREAS OR CONTENT AREAS IN
- 25 WHICH NO FEWER THAN TEN STUDENTS WERE TESTED.
- 26 (7) REPORT THE NUMBER OF FACULTY TEACHING A SUBJECT
- 27 MATTER AREA OR CONTENT AREA, THE NUMBER OF FACULTY THAT HAVE
- OBTAINED A TEACHER CERTIFICATION AND THE NUMBER OF FACULTY
- 29 WHO HAVE CLASSROOM TEACHING EXPERIENCE.
- $\frac{(7)}{(8)}$ (8) Such other information as deemed necessary by

- 1 the department.
- 2 Section 5. Duties of department.
- 3 (a) Form development.--The department shall prepare a
- 4 uniform report card form and distribute that form to each
- 5 Pennsylvania institution of higher education no later than April
- 6 15 of each academic year. The form shall include a description
- 7 of each requirement in section 4 (relating to teacher assessment
- 8 report card) written in plain English.
- 9 (b) Statewide report.--
- 10 (1) Upon receipt of the completed report card
- information from the individual institution of higher
- education by a date certain established by the department,
- 13 the department shall compile a Statewide report for the
- 14 academic year for which data is supplied and the prior two
- 15 academic years, including a listing of each institution of
- higher education and the information required under section
- 17 4.
- 18 (2) For purposes of the Statewide report, the department
- 19 shall not be required to compile or distribute data for the
- 20 prior two academic years until such time as the data becomes
- 21 available.
- 22 (3) (i) The department shall make available to each
- 23 institution of higher education a draft copy of its
- 24 Statewide report before initiating the final report
- required by subsection (c).
- 26 (ii) An institution of higher education shall have
- 27 20 days from receipt of its draft Statewide report to
- 28 make any necessary changes and submit such changes to the
- 29 department. Any change made to a draft Statewide report
- 30 by an institution of higher education shall be

- 1 accompanied by documentation proving the need for the change. SUBMIT CORRECTIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT. CORRECTIONS 2 3 SHALL BE ACCOMPANIED BY SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION. 4 The information received under section 4 shall be deemed to be accurate for any institution of higher education 5 that does not resubmit its draft Statewide report to the 6 7 department on a timely basis. 8 (c) Release of final report. -- No later than January 1 following the academic year for which report card data has been 10 furnished by the institutions of higher education, except that 11 for the 2005 2006 2006-2007 academic year when the date shall be February 1, the department shall furnish each institution of 12 13 higher education with its completed report card. The report card shall include information as specified in section 4 and the 14 15 Statewide report as specified in subsection (b). 16 Section 6. Dissemination of report card. 17 (a) Students.--No later than March 1, except for the 2005- 18 2006 2006-2007 academic year when the date shall be April 1, <----19 each institution of higher education shall make the applicable 20 report card available to postsecondary students in approved 21 teacher education programs either at the office of the dean or 22 head of the teacher education program of the respective 23 institution of higher education or by posting the report card on 24 the campus Internet website. 25 (b) General public. -- The department shall publicize the 26 Statewide results as defined in section 5(c) (relating to duties 27 of department) by posting the report on the department's 28 Internet website no later than March 1, except for the 2005 2006
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(c) General Assembly. -- The department shall forward a copy

- 5 Section 7. Cause of action.
- 6 Nothing in this act shall be construed as establishing cause
- 7 of action for educational malpractice by students.
- 8 Section 8. Additional requirements.
- 9 (a) State Board of Education. -- The State Board of Education
- 10 shall adopt policies, standards, rules and regulations necessary
- 11 for the proper administration and implementation of this act.
- 12 (b) Department of Education. -- The Department of Education
- 13 shall provide technical assistance to institutions of higher
- 14 education in completing forms as required by section 3(a)
- 15 (relating to duties of institutions of higher education).
- 16 Section 9. Effective date.
- 17 This act shall take effect July 1, 2005 2006, or immediately, <—
- 18 whichever is later.
