6 REENACTING AND AMENDING THE ACT OF SEPTEMBER 30, 1983
7 (P.L.160, NO.39), ENTITLED "AN ACT ESTABLISHING SALARIES AND
8 COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN PUBLIC OFFICIALS INCLUDING JUSTICES
9 AND JUDGES OF STATEWIDE COURTS, JUDGES OF COURTS OF COMMON
10 PLEAS, JUDGES OF THE PHILADELPHIA MUNICIPAL COURT, JUDGES OF
11 THE PHILADELPHIA TRAFFIC COURT, DISTRICT JUSTICES AND THE
12 GOVERNOR, THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, THE STATE TREASURER, THE
13 AUDITOR GENERAL, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL AND CERTAIN OTHER STATE

5 SECTION 1. DECLARATION OF POLICY. <—

6 (A) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES THAT THE REENACTMENT OF
7 THE SUPERSEDED PROVISIONS OF THE ACT OF SEPTEMBER 30, 1983
8 (P.L.160, NO.39), KNOWN AS THE PUBLIC OFFICIAL COMPENSATION LAW,
9 IS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE REPEAL OF THE ACT OF JULY 7, 2005
10 (P.L.201, NO.44), ENTITLED "AN ACT AMENDING TITLES 42 (JUDICIARY
11 AND JUDICIAL PROCEDURE) 46 (LEGISLATURE) AND 71 (STATE
12 GOVERNMENT) OF THE PENNSYLVANIA CONSOLIDATED STATUTES, PROVIDING
13 FOR COMPENSATION; AND MAKING AN INCONSISTENT REPEAL," AND TO
14 ADOPT SALARIES IN EFFECT ON JULY 6, 2005.

15 (B) THE EXERCISE OF THE AUTHORITY OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO
16 ESTABLISH THE SALARY OF THE JUSTICES, JUDGES AND JUSTICES OF THE
17 PEACE PURSUANT TO SECTION 1 OF ARTICLE II AND SECTION 16(A) OF
18 ARTICLE V OF THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA IS NOT INTENDED TO
19 DIMINISH OR INFRINGE ON, OR OTHERWISE INTERFERE WITH, THE
20 INDEPENDENCE OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM OR THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

21 (C) FOR PURPOSES OF IMPLEMENTING THIS ACT AND RESTORING
22 SALARIES IN EFFECT ON JULY 6, 2005, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS
23 AND DECLARES THAT THE OFFICIALS REFERRED TO IN THIS ACT SHALL
24 CONSTITUTE THE "SALARIED OFFICERS OF THE COMMONWEALTH" FOR
25 PURPOSES OF SECTION 16(A) OF ARTICLE V OF THE CONSTITUTION OF
26 PENNSYLVANIA.

20 THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES WHEN USED IN THIS CHAPTER

22 CONTEXT CLEARLY INDICATES OTHERWISE:

23 "BASE SALARY." THE SALARY FOR THE DESIGNATED FEDERAL
24 OFFICIAL AS OF JANUARY 1, 2005.

25 § 1802. SUPREME COURT.

26 (A) JUSTICES.--EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (B), A
27 JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT SHALL RECEIVE AS AN ANNUAL SALARY
28 THE BASE SALARY OF A CIRCUIT JUDGE OF THE UNITED STATES COURT OF
29 APPEALS PLUS ALL ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1810 (RELATING TO
30 COST OF LIVING).

(B) CHIEF JUSTICE.--IN ADDITION TO THE SALARY UNDER
SUBSECTION (A), THE CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT SHALL
RECEIVE \$5,000.

§ 1803. SUPERIOR COURT.

(A) JUDGES.--EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (B), A JUDGE
OF THE SUPERIOR COURT SHALL RECEIVE AS AN ANNUAL SALARY THE BASE
SALARY OF A JUDGE OF THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT PLUS ALL
ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1810 (RELATING TO COST OF LIVING).

(B) PRESIDENT JUDGE.--IN ADDITION TO THE SALARY UNDER
SUBSECTION (A), THE PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT SHALL
RECEIVE \$5,000.

§ 1804. COMMONWEALTH COURT.

(A) JUDGES.--EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (B), A JUDGE
OF THE COMMONWEALTH COURT SHALL RECEIVE AS AN ANNUAL SALARY THE
BASE SALARY OF A JUDGE OF THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT PLUS
ALL ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1810 (RELATING TO COST OF LIVING).

(B) PRESIDENT JUDGE.--IN ADDITION TO THE SALARY UNDER
SUBSECTION (A), THE PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COMMONWEALTH COURT
SHALL RECEIVE \$5,000.

§ 1805. COURTS OF COMMON PLEAS.

(A) JUDGES.--EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (B), A JUDGE
OF A COURT OF COMMON PLEAS SHALL RECEIVE AS AN ANNUAL SALARY THE
BASE SALARY OF A UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE JUDGE PLUS ALL
ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1810 (RELATING TO COST OF LIVING).

(B) PRESIDENT JUDGES.--IN ADDITION TO THE SALARY UNDER
SUBSECTION (A), THE PRESIDENT JUDGE OF A COURT OF COMMON PLEAS
SHALL RECEIVE ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
FOLLOWING SCHEDULE:

(1) ALLEGHENY COUNTY, \$2,500.

(2) PHILADELPHIA COUNTY, \$3,000.

(3) JUDICIAL DISTRICTS HAVING SIX OR MORE JUDGES,
\$1,300.

(4) JUDICIAL DISTRICTS HAVING ONE TO FIVE JUDGES, \$650.

(5) ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGES OF THE DIVISIONS OF THE COURT
OF COMMON PLEAS OF PHILADELPHIA COUNTY WITH DIVISIONS OF SIX
OR MORE JUDGES, \$1,300.

(6) ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGES OF THE DIVISIONS OF THE COURT
OF COMMON PLEAS OF PHILADELPHIA COUNTY WITH DIVISIONS OF FIVE
OR FEWER JUDGES, \$650.

(7) ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGES OF THE DIVISIONS OF THE COURT
OF COMMON PLEAS OF ALLEGHENY COUNTY WITH DIVISIONS OF SIX OR
MORE JUDGES, \$1,300.

(8) ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGES OF THE DIVISIONS OF THE COURT
OF COMMON PLEAS OF ALLEGHENY COUNTY WITH DIVISIONS OF FIVE OR
FEWER JUDGES, \$650.

§ 1806. PHILADELPHIA MUNICIPAL COURT.

(A) JUDGES.--EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (B), A JUDGE
OF THE PHILADELPHIA MUNICIPAL COURT SHALL RECEIVE AS AN ANNUAL
SALARY THE BASE SALARY OF A UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE JUDGE MINUS
\$3,450 PLUS ALL ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1810 (RELATING TO COST
OF LIVING).

(B) PRESIDENT JUDGE.--IN ADDITION TO THE SALARY UNDER
SUBSECTION (A), THE PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE PHILADELPHIA
MUNICIPAL COURT SHALL RECEIVE \$2,250.

§ 1807. PHILADELPHIA TRAFFIC COURT.

(A) JUDGES.--EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (B), A JUDGE
OF THE PHILADELPHIA TRAFFIC COURT SHALL RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY
EQUAL TO 50% OF THE ANNUAL SALARY DETERMINED UNDER SECTION
1805(A) (RELATING TO COURTS OF COMMON PLEAS) PLUS \$3,800.

(B) PRESIDENT JUDGE.--IN ADDITION TO THE SALARY UNDER

1 SUBSECTION (A), THE PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE PHILADELPHIA TRAFFIC
2 COURT SHALL RECEIVE \$650.

3 § 1808. MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUDGES.

4 A MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUDGE SHALL RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY
5 EQUAL TO 50% OF THE ANNUAL SALARY DETERMINED UNDER SECTION
6 1805(A) (RELATING TO COURTS OF COMMON PLEAS).

7 § 1809. SENIOR JUDGES.

8 (A) AMOUNT.--THE COMPENSATION PAYABLE TO A SENIOR JUDGE OF A
9 COURT OF COMMON PLEAS, A SENIOR COMMONWEALTH COURT JUDGE, A
10 SENIOR SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE AND A SENIOR SUPREME COURT JUSTICE,
11 ASSIGNED PURSUANT TO SECTION 4121 (RELATING TO ASSIGNMENT OF
12 JUDGES), AND A SENIOR PHILADELPHIA MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE
13 ASSIGNED PURSUANT TO SECTION 4124 (RELATING TO ASSIGNMENT OF
14 SENIOR PHILADELPHIA MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGES) SHALL BE \$456 PER
15 DAY PLUS ALL ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1810(A)(1)(II) (RELATING
16 TO COST OF LIVING). IN ANY CALENDAR YEAR THE AMOUNT OF
17 COMPENSATION WHICH A SENIOR JUDGE SHALL BE PERMITTED TO EARN AS
18 A SENIOR JUDGE SHALL NOT, WHEN ADDED TO RETIREMENT INCOME PAID
19 BY THE COMMONWEALTH FOR THE SENIOR JUDGE, EXCEED THE ANNUAL
20 SALARY PAYABLE BY THE COMMONWEALTH TO A JUDGE THEN IN REGULAR
21 ACTIVE SERVICE ON THE COURT FROM WHICH THE SENIOR JUDGE RETIRED.

22 (B) LIMITATION.--IN ANY CALENDAR YEAR, THE AMOUNT OF
23 COMPENSATION WHICH A SENIOR JUDGE ASSIGNED TO SERVE ON A COURT
24 REFERRED TO IN SECTION 1806 (RELATING TO PHILADELPHIA MUNICIPAL
25 COURT), 1807 (RELATING TO PHILADELPHIA TRAFFIC COURT) OR 1808
26 (RELATING TO MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUDGES) SHALL BE PERMITTED TO
27 EARN AS A SENIOR JUDGE SHALL NOT, WHEN ADDED TO RETIREMENT
28 INCOME PAID BY THE COMMONWEALTH TO THAT SENIOR JUDGE, EXCEED THE
29 COMPENSATION PAYABLE BY THE COMMONWEALTH TO A JUDGE THEN IN
30 REGULAR ACTIVE SERVICE ON THE COURT FROM WHICH THAT SENIOR JUDGE

1 RETIRED.

2 (C) VOLUNTEER SERVICE.--A SENIOR JUDGE WHO SO ELECTS MAY
3 SERVE WITHOUT BEING PAID ALL OR ANY PORTION OF THE COMPENSATION
4 PROVIDED BY THIS SECTION.

6 NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 1401(G) OF THE ACT OF AUGUST 9, 1955
7 (P.L.323, NO.130), KNOWN AS THE COUNTY CODE, THE SALARY OF A
8 DISTRICT ATTORNEY AND A PART-TIME DISTRICT ATTORNEY SHALL BE
9 DETERMINED AS FOLLOWS:

10 (1) THE SALARY OF A FULL-TIME DISTRICT ATTORNEY SHALL BE
11 95% OF THE SALARY OF A JUDGE OF THE COURT OF COMMON PLEAS
12 UNDER SECTION 1805(A) (RELATING TO COURT OF COMMON PLEAS).

13 (2) THE SALARY OF A PART-TIME DISTRICT ATTORNEY SHALL BE
14 DETERMINED AS FOLLOWS:

15 (I) COUNTIES OF THE THIRD OR FOURTH CLASS SHALL BE
16 60% OF THE SALARY UNDER PARAGRAPH (1).

17 (II) COUNTIES OF THE FIFTH OR SIXTH CLASS SHALL BE
18 50% OF THE SALARY UNDER PARAGRAPH (1).

19 (III) COUNTIES OF THE SEVENTH OR EIGHTH CLASS SHALL

22 (A) INCREASE.--BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2007, AND EACH JANUARY 1

25 (1) EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN PARAGRAPH (2), BY THE GREATER
26 OF:

27 (I) THE PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN THE SALARY OF THE
28 APPLICABLE DESIGNATED FEDERAL OFFICIAL DURING THE
29 IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING PERIOD FROM DECEMBER 1 THROUGH
30 NOVEMBER 30; OR

1 (II) THE PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN THE CONSUMER PRICE
2 INDEX FOR ALL URBAN CONSUMERS (CPI-U) FOR THE
3 PENNSYLVANIA, NEW JERSEY, DELAWARE AND MARYLAND AREA FOR
4 THE MOST RECENT 12-MONTH PERIOD FOR WHICH FIGURES HAVE
5 BEEN OFFICIALLY REPORTED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT
6 OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS.

7 (2) IF THE SALARY OF THE APPLICABLE DESIGNATED FEDERAL
8 OFFICIAL HAS BEEN INCREASED IN THE PREVIOUS 12-MONTH PERIOD
9 AFTER NOT HAVING BEEN INCREASED IN ONE OR MORE PREVIOUS
10 CONSECUTIVE 12-MONTH PERIODS, THE CURRENT ANNUAL SALARIES
11 UNDER THIS CHAPTER SHALL BE INCREASED BY THE GREATER OF:

12 (I) THE PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE CONSUMER PRICE
13 INDEX FOR ALL URBAN CONSUMERS (CPI-U) FOR THE
14 PENNSYLVANIA, NEW JERSEY, DELAWARE AND MARYLAND AREA FOR
15 THE MOST RECENT 12-MONTH PERIOD FOR WHICH FIGURES HAVE
16 BEEN OFFICIALLY REPORTED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT
17 OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS; OR

18 (II) THE EXCESS OF THE PERCENTAGE OF THE INCREASE IN
19 THE SALARY OF THE APPLICABLE DESIGNATED FEDERAL OFFICIAL
20 OVER THE CUMULATIVE PERCENTAGE INCREASE OF THE CHANGE IN
21 THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR ALL URBAN CONSUMERS (CPI-U)
22 FOR THE PENNSYLVANIA, NEW JERSEY, DELAWARE AND MARYLAND
23 AREA FOR THE SAME PERIOD OF TIME BETWEEN THE MOST CURRENT
24 INCREASE IN THE SALARY OF THE APPLICABLE DESIGNATED
25 FEDERAL OFFICIAL AND THE IMMEDIATE PRIOR INCREASE.

26 (B) ADMINISTRATION.--THE ANNUAL SALARIES AS ADJUSTED UNDER
27 SUBSECTION (A) SHALL BE PUBLISHED IN THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN
28 BY THE COURT ADMINISTRATOR OF PENNSYLVANIA BY JANUARY 1, 2007,
29 AND BY EACH JANUARY 1 THEREAFTER.

§ 1102. MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

(A) SENATE.--EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN SECTION 1103(A)
(RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE OFFICERS AND LEADERS), A MEMBER OF THE
SENATE SHALL RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY EQUAL TO 50% OF THE BASE
SALARY OF A MEMBER OF THE UNITED STATES HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
PLUS ALL ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1104 (RELATING TO COST OF
LIVING).

(B) HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.--EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN
SECTION 1103(B), A MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SHALL

1 RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY EQUAL TO 50% OF THE BASE SALARY OF A
2 MEMBER OF THE UNITED STATES HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES PLUS ALL
3 ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1104.

4 § 1103. LEGISLATIVE OFFICERS AND LEADERS.

5 (A) SENATE.--ANNUAL SALARIES FOR LEGISLATIVE OFFICERS AND
6 LEADERS OF THE SENATE ARE AS FOLLOWS:

7 (1) EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN PARAGRAPH (5)(I), A COMMITTEE
8 CHAIRMAN SHALL RECEIVE 55% OF THE BASE SALARY OF A MEMBER OF
9 THE UNITED STATES HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES PLUS ALL
10 ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1104 (RELATING TO COST OF LIVING).

11 (2) A COMMITTEE VICE CHAIRMAN SHALL RECEIVE 52.5% OF THE
12 BASE SALARY OF A MEMBER OF THE UNITED STATES HOUSE OF
13 REPRESENTATIVES PLUS ALL ADJUSTMENTS UNDER SECTION 1104.

14 (3) THE FOLLOWING SHALL RECEIVE THE SALARY DETERMINED

21 SHALL BE DETERMINED JOINTLY BY THE CHIEF CLERK OF THE SENATE AND

23 ANNUAL EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ADJUSTMENT AND SHALL BE PUBLISHED
24 BY THEM IN THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN WITHIN TEN DAYS OF THE DATE

26 (D.1) SUBSEQUENT ANNUAL COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENT FOR
27 OFFICERS AND LEADERS.--FOR THE 12-MONTH PERIOD BEGINNING
28 DECEMBER 1, 1997, THROUGH NOVEMBER 30, 1998, AND FOR EACH LIKE
29 12-MONTH PERIOD THEREAFTER, THE ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION OF THE
30 OFFICERS AND LEADERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL BE INCREASED

1 BY AN ANNUAL COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENT CALCULATED BY APPLYING

28 THE REENACTMENT OF PROVISIONS OF THE ACT OF SEPTEMBER 30,

30 LAW, IN SECTIONS 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 AND 8 OF THIS ACT IS A

1 CONTINUATION OF THE PUBLIC OFFICIAL COMPENSATION LAW AS OF JULY
2 6, 2005.

3 SECTION 10. COMPENSATION.

4 THE OFFICIALS REFERRED TO IN THIS ACT SHALL, ON AND AFTER THE
5 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS PROVIDED
6 BY LAW AND SUCH ADDITIONAL ADJUSTMENTS AS AUTHORIZED BY LAW AND
7 IN EFFECT ON JULY 6, 2005.

8 SECTION 11. RETROACTIVITY.

9 SECTION 9 OF THIS ACT SHALL APPLY RETROACTIVELY TO JULY 6,
