AN ACT

- 1 Providing for State funding for the Low Income Home Energy 2 Assistance Program.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Low Income
- 7 Home Energy Assistance State Assistance Act.
- 8 Section 2. Legislative findings.
- 9 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 10 (1) Since the creation of LIHEAP in 1981, the
- 11 Commonwealth has not contributed any State funds to this

- 1 program.
- 2 (2) Other states have recognized the need to supplement
- 3 the Federal funds for home heating energy assistance with
- 4 state funds.
- 5 (3) Heating oil and propane gas companies and public
- 6 utilities that provide electricity and natural gas also
- 7 recognize the need to contribute funds for energy assistance
- 8 by their establishment of hardship funds.
- 9 (4) Because of the rising costs of home heating, the
- 10 Commonwealth should contribute State funds to supplement
- 11 LIHEAP in order to provide assistance to those eligible.
- 12 Section 3. Definitions.
- 13 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 14 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 15 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 16 "Commission." The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.
- 17 "Department." The Department of Public Welfare of the
- 18 Commonwealth.
- 19 "Hardship funds." Funds established by a home energy
- 20 provider or utility to provide cash assistance to those
- 21 ratepayers who have exhausted all other resources for payment of
- 22 electricity, heating oil, natural gas or propane gas bills.
- 23 "Home energy provider." A heating oil, propane gas company
- 24 or public utility that provides oil, electricity or natural gas
- 25 to ratepayers in this Commonwealth.
- 26 "LIHEAP." The program established by Title XXVI of the
- 27 Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981 (Public Law 97-35, 42
- 28 U.S.C. § 8621 et seq.) and administered by the Department of
- 29 Public Welfare.
- 30 "Ratepayer." A person in whose name a residential service

- 1 account is listed and who is primarily responsible for payment
- 2 of a bill rendered for service.
- 3 Section 4. Commitment.
- 4 The Commonwealth shall provide funding to LIHEAP equal to the
- 5 amount contributed by the stockholders, employees and ratepayers
- 6 of home energy providers to their hardship funds as contained in
- 7 the most recent data reported to the commission or obtained
- 8 otherwise.
- 9 Section 5. Distribution.
- 10 The money committed to LIHEAP shall be administered by the
- 11 department in accordance with the cash assistance portion of
- 12 LIHEAP.
- 13 Section 20. Effective date.
- 14 This act shall take effect immediately.
