AN ACT

- Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for
 limitations on actions and for other offenses.

 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
 hereby enacts as follows:
 Section 1. Sections 5551 and 5552(c) of Title 42 of the
 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 8 § 5551. No limitation applicable.
- 9 A prosecution for the following offenses may be commenced at 10 any time:
- 11 (1) Murder.
- 12 (2) Voluntary manslaughter.
- 13 (3) Conspiracy to commit murder or solicitation to
 14 commit murder if a murder results from the conspiracy or
 15 solicitation.
- (4) Any felony alleged to have been perpetrated in

 connection with a murder of the first or second degree, as

 set forth in 18 Pa.C.S. § 2502(a) or (b) and (d) (relating to

1	murder).
2	(5) A violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3742 (relating to
3	accidents involving death or personal injury) or 3732
4	(relating to homicide by vehicle) if the accused was the
5	driver of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in the
6	death of any person.
7	(6) Any of those offenses set forth in 18 Pa.C.S.
8	(relating to crimes and offenses) which are against a victim
9	under 18 years of age by an offender four or more years older
LO	than the victim, as follows:
L1	Section 3121 (relating to rape).
L2	Section 3122.1 (relating to statutory sexual
L3	assault).
L4	Section 3123 (relating to involuntary deviate sexual
L5	<u>intercourse).</u>
L6	Section 3124.1 (relating to sexual assault).
L7	Section 3125 (relating to aggravated indecent
L8	assault).

- 5 (c) Exceptions.--If the period prescribed in subsection (a),
