AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for sexual abuse of 3 children. UNLAWFUL CONTACT WITH A MINOR. <—
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 6318 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 6318. Unlawful contact with minor.
- 9 (a) Offense defined.--A person commits an offense if he is
- 10 intentionally in contact with a minor, or a law enforcement
- 11 officer acting in the performance of his duties who has assumed
- 12 the identity of a minor, for the purpose of engaging in an
- 13 activity prohibited under any of the following, and either the

- 1 person initiating the contact or the person being contacted is
- 2 within this Commonwealth:
- 3 (1) Any of the offenses enumerated in Chapter 31
- 4 (relating to sexual offenses).
- 5 (2) Open lewdness as defined in section 5901 (relating
- 6 to open lewdness).
- 7 (3) Prostitution as defined in section 5902 (relating to
- 8 prostitution and related offenses).
- 9 (4) Obscene and other sexual materials and performances
- 10 as defined in section 5903 (relating to obscene and other
- 11 sexual materials and performances).
- 12 (5) Sexual abuse of children as defined in section 6312
- 13 (relating to sexual abuse of children).
- 14 (6) Sexual exploitation of children as defined in
- section 6320 (relating to sexual exploitation of children).
- 16 (b) Grading. -- A violation of subsection (a) is:
- 17 (1) an offense of the same grade and degree as the most
- 18 serious underlying offense in subsection (a) for which the
- 19 defendant contacted the minor; or
- 20 (2) a [misdemeanor] <u>felony</u> of the [first] <u>third</u> degree;
- 21 whichever is greater.
- 22 (b.1) Concurrent jurisdiction to prosecute. -- The Attorney
- 23 General shall have concurrent prosecutorial jurisdiction with
- 24 the district attorney for violations under this section and any
- 25 crime arising out of the activity prohibited by this section
- 26 when the person charged with a violation of this section
- 27 contacts a minor through the use of a computer, computer system
- 28 or computer network. No person charged with a violation of this
- 29 section by the Attorney General shall have standing to challenge
- 30 the authority of the Attorney General to prosecute the case,

- 1 and, if any such challenge is made, the challenge shall be
- 2 dismissed and no relief shall be available in the courts of this
- 3 Commonwealth to the person making the challenge.
- 4 (c) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 5 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 6 subsection:
- 7 "Computer." An electronic, magnetic, optical, hydraulic,
- 8 organic or other high-speed data processing device or system
- 9 which performs logic, arithmetic or memory functions and
- 10 includes all input, output, processing, storage, software or
- 11 communication facilities which are connected or related to the
- 12 device in a computer system or computer network.
- "Computer network." The interconnection of two or more
- 14 computers through the usage of satellite, microwave, line or
- 15 other communication medium.
- 16 "Computer system." A set of related, connected or
- 17 unconnected computer equipment, devices and software.
- 18 "Contacts." Direct or indirect contact or communication by
- 19 any means, method or device, including contact or communication
- 20 in person or through an agent or agency, through any print
- 21 medium, the mails, a common carrier or communication common
- 22 carrier, any electronic communication system and any
- 23 telecommunications, wire, computer or radio communications
- 24 device or system.
- 25 "Minor." An individual under 18 years of age.
- 26 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
