AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the creation of a model domestic abuse awareness
- 2 and assistance program and for related powers and duties of
- 3 the Department of Labor and Industry.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Domestic
- 8 Abuse Assistance and Awareness in the Workplace Act.
- 9 Section 2. Legislative findings and declarations.
- 10 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 11 (1) There is an ever-increasing number of persons in
- 12 this Commonwealth who are affected by domestic abuse. Studies
- 13 have indicated that, nationally, one in three women is a
- 14 victim of domestic abuse. Domestic abuse not only causes
- 15 physical injury but also loss of trust, loss of personal
- safety in one's own home, loss of self-esteem and loss of
- 17 control over one's own life. Domestic abuse can also extend
- into the workplace by leading to lost wages, higher health

- 1 care costs, lower productivity, excessive absenteeism and
- 2 increased security needs.
- 3 (2) Domestic abuse directly affects workplaces when
- 4 batterers attack, stalk or harass women at work. Nationally,
- 5 94% of corporate security directors surveyed rank domestic
- 6 abuse as a high security problem. It has been estimated that
- 7 the total medical cost of domestic abuse in Pennsylvania
- 8 exceeds the medical cost of elder abuse, child abuse and
- 9 street violence combined. Employers throughout this
- 10 Commonwealth can and should take steps to make workplaces
- safer for employees who are victims of domestic abuse.
- 12 Appropriate workplace programs relating to domestic abuse
- benefit both the victims and their employers by promoting
- 14 support and safety.
- 15 (3) It is the intent of the General Assembly to reaffirm
- the Commonwealth's commitment to victims of domestic abuse by
- 17 providing awareness and assistance to employers and employees
- in the workplace.
- 19 Section 3. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 21 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 22 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 23 "Department." The Department of Labor and Industry of the
- 24 Commonwealth.
- 25 "Domestic abuse." The occurrence of one or more of the
- 26 following acts between family or household members, sexual or
- 27 intimate partners or persons who share biological parenthood:
- 28 (1) Attempting to cause or intentionally, knowingly or
- 29 recklessly causing bodily injury, serious bodily injury,
- 30 rape, involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, sexual assault,

- statutory sexual assault, aggravated indecent assault,
- 2 indecent assault or incest with or without a deadly weapon.
- 3 (2) Placing another in reasonable fear of imminent
- 4 serious bodily injury.
- 5 (3) Inflicting false imprisonment pursuant to 18 Pa.C.S.
- 6 § 2903 (relating to false imprisonment).
- 7 (4) Physically or sexually abusing minor children,
- 8 including such terms as defined in 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63
- 9 (relating to child protective services).
- 10 (5) Knowingly engaging in a course of conduct or
- 11 repeatedly committing acts toward another person, including
- following the person, without proper authority, under
- circumstances which place the person in reasonable fear of
- 14 bodily injury.
- 15 "Family or household members." Spouses or persons who have
- 16 been spouses, persons living as spouses or who lived as spouses,
- 17 parents and children, other persons related by consanguinity or
- 18 affinity, current or former sexual or intimate partners or
- 19 persons who share biological parenthood.
- 20 "Secretary." The Secretary of Labor and Industry of the
- 21 Commonwealth.
- 22 "Victim." A victim of domestic abuse.
- 23 Section 4. Powers and duties.
- 24 The secretary shall, in consultation with the Physician
- 25 General of the Commonwealth, the Pennsylvania Coalition Against
- 26 Domestic Violence, the Pennsylvania State Police and any other
- 27 entities deemed necessary, develop a model domestic abuse
- 28 awareness and assistance program for use by employers throughout
- 29 this Commonwealth.
- 30 Section 5. Program goal and availability.

- 1 The program shall be directed at:
- 2 (1) educating employers and employees in the workplace
- 3 to recognize the signs and effects of domestic abuse;
- 4 (2) providing training to security personnel about how
- 5 to handle crimes committed in or around the workplace by
- 6 perpetrators of abuse; and
- 7 (3) offering support and safety to victims while in the
- 8 workplace.
- 9 The program shall be made available by the department upon
- 10 request of employers in this Commonwealth.
- 11 Section 6. Regulations.
- 12 The department shall promulgate regulations to implement this
- 13 act.
- 14 Section 7. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
