16	Section 1. Sections 4 and 5 of the act of October 27, 1955
17	(P.L.744, No.222), known as the Pennsylvania Human Relations

Section 5. Unlawful Discriminatory Practices.--It shall be an unlawful discriminatory practice, unless based upon a bona fide occupational qualification, or in the case of a fraternal corporation or association, unless based upon membership in such association or corporation, or except where based upon applicable security regulations established by the United States or the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania:

9 (m) For any employer, employment agency or labor

10 organization to refuse to hire or employ, or to bar or discharge

11 from employment, or withhold pay, demote or penalize, or

12 <u>otherwise discriminate against a lactating individual because</u>

13 <u>the individual breastfeeds or expresses milk at the workplace.</u>

Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: Section 5.4. Breastfeeding by Employes.--No employer shall prohibit an employe from expressing breastmilk during any meal period or other break period required by law to be provided by the employer or required by collective bargaining agreement.

20 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
