AN ACT

1 2 3	Redesignating the Maple Avenue Bridge on State Route 271 in the City of Johnstown, Cambria County, as the Colonel John Joseph Tominac Memorial Bridge.
4	WHEREAS, Colonel John Joseph Tominac, a native son of
5	Conemaugh who later lived in Franklin Borough, bravely served
б	our country with distinction in Europe during World War II as a
7	member of Company I, 15th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Infantry
8	Division, of the United States Army; and
9	WHEREAS, Colonel Tominac was awarded the Congressional Medal
10	of Honor by Lieutenant General Alexander M. Patch on April 22,
11	1945, at Zeppelin Stadium in Nuremberg, Germany; and
12	WHEREAS, The citation presented with the medal recognized
13	Colonel Tominac, then a First Lieutenant, for conspicuous
14	gallantry and bravery at the risk of life above and beyond the
15	call of duty in an attack on Saulx de Vesoul, France, on

1 September 12, 1944; and

2 WHEREAS, Despite a painful shoulder wound from enemy 3 shrapnel, Colonel Tominac fought with outstanding heroism and 4 displayed exemplary leadership; and

5 WHEREAS, His actions resulted in the destruction of four 6 successive enemy defensive positions, surrender of a vital 7 sector of the city of Saulx de Vesoul and the death of at least 8 60 enemy soldiers; and

9 WHEREAS, Colonel Tominac was also awarded the Legion of Merit 10 with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Bronze Star with "V" and Oak Leaf 11 Cluster, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Army Commendation 12 Medal, the Purple Heart, the Distinguished Unit Citation with 13 Oak Leaf Cluster, the French Fourragere and the Combat Infantry 14 Badge; and

WHEREAS, After a distinguished military career of 37 years, including service in the Korean War, this dedicated army officer retired in 1979 and passed away in 1998 at the age of 76.

18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 19 hereby enacts as follows:

20 Section 1. Colonel John Joseph Tominac Memorial Bridge.

(a) Designation.--The bridge carrying State Route 271 over
the Little Conemaugh River and the Norfolk Southern mainline in
the City of Johnstown, Cambria County, known as the Maple Avenue
Bridge, is redesignated as the Colonel John Joseph Tominac
Memorial Bridge.

(b) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
maintain appropriate signs displaying the redesignated name of
the bridge to traffic in both directions.

29 Section 2. Effective date.

30 This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
