AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Pharmaceutical Medbank Program; providing for
- 2 program administration and eligibility and for
- responsibilities of organizations under the program;
- 4 conferring powers and imposing duties on the Department of
- 5 Aging; and making an appropriation.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Short title.
- 9 This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 10 Pharmaceutical Medbank Program.
- 11 Section 2. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Department." The Department of Aging of the Commonwealth.
- 16 "Organization." An entity which is organized as a nonprofit
- 17 corporation or nonprofit unincorporated association under the
- 18 laws of this Commonwealth or the United States.

- 1 "Program." The Pharmaceutical Medbank Program established
- 2 under this act.
- 3 Section 3. Program.
- 4 (a) Establishment.--The Pharmaceutical Medbank Program is
- 5 established and shall be administered by the department. The
- 6 program shall assist individuals who lack prescription drug
- 7 coverage in receiving medically necessary prescription drugs
- 8 through patient assistance programs sponsored by pharmaceutical
- 9 drug manufacturers.
- 10 (b) Availability. -- The department shall ensure that the
- 11 program is available to residents throughout this Commonwealth
- 12 and shall provide additional support in areas that have the
- 13 greatest need for services.
- 14 (c) Contract. -- The department shall contract with at least
- 15 one organization to operate and maintain the program. The
- 16 department may enter into a contract with an organization that
- 17 meets at a minimum the following criteria:
- 18 (1) The organization has an established history of
- 19 community activity especially with assisting individuals with
- 20 pharmaceutical companies' patient assistance programs.
- 21 (2) The organization is not a subsidiary of any
- 22 pharmaceutical company.
- 23 (3) Neither the organization nor any of its members
- 24 participate in legal proceedings on the behalf of any person,
- 25 group or other special interest.
- 26 (d) Multiple contracts.--Nothing in this act shall prevent
- 27 the department from contracting with more than one organization
- 28 in order to meet the requirements of this act.
- 29 Section 4. Eligibility.
- 30 Eligibility for any individual shall be limited only by the

- 1 criteria established by pharmaceutical manufacturers for their
- 2 respective patient assistance programs.
- 3 Section 5. Reporting by nonprofit corporations.
- 4 The department shall require detailed financial reports at
- 5 least quarterly from any organization that operates and
- 6 maintains the program. These reports shall contain at a minimum:
- 7 (1) The number and demographic characteristics of the
- 8 State residents served by the program.
- 9 (2) The types and retail value of prescription drugs
- 10 accessed through the program.
- 11 (3) The nature and extent of outreach performed to
- inform physicians and residents of the assistance available
- 13 through the program.
- 14 (4) The total volume and retail value of each brand name
- drug, by manufacturer, accessed through the program.
- 16 Section 6. Responsibilities of organizations.
- 17 Each organization contracted by the department shall:
- 18 (1) Provide programs with the approval of the department
- 19 that:
- 20 (i) Promote public awareness of the need to provide
- 21 pharmaceutical assistance as cost-effective care for
- 22 uninsured Pennsylvanians.
- 23 (ii) Expand access to health care services for
- 24 uninsured individuals.
- 25 (2) Be permitted to solicit and accept any gift, grant,
- 26 legacy or endowment of money, including in-kind services,
- 27 from the Federal, State or local government or any private
- source in furtherance of the organization's purpose.
- 29 (3) Develop programs for sponsorship by corporate and
- 30 business organizations or private individuals.

- 1 (4) Develop criteria for evaluating the effectiveness of
- 2 programs receiving grants.
- 3 (5) Make, execute and enter into any contract or other
- 4 legal instrument.
- 5 (6) Lease and maintain an office within this
- 6 Commonwealth that the organization designates.
- 7 (7) Administer the program in accordance with
- 8 regulations promulgated by the department.
- 9 (8) Report annually to the Governor and the General
- 10 Assembly on its activities during the preceding year,
- including and evaluation of the effectiveness of funded
- 12 programs, together with any recommendations or requests
- deemed appropriate to further the purposes of the
- 14 organization.
- 15 (9) Take any other action necessary to carry out the
- 16 responsibilities of the organization under this act.
- 17 Section 7. Regulations.
- 18 The department shall promulgate rules and regulations to
- 19 carry out the provisions of this act.
- 20 Section 8. Appropriation.
- The sum of \$2,000,000, or as much thereof as may be
- 22 necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Aging for
- 23 the fiscal year July 1, 2007, to June 30, 2008, to carry out the
- 24 provisions of this act.
- 25 Section 9. Effective date.
- 26 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
