AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), entitled "An 2 act relating to insurance; amending, revising, and consolidating the law providing for the incorporation of 3 4 insurance companies, and the regulation, supervision, and protection of home and foreign insurance companies, Lloyds associations, reciprocal and inter-insurance exchanges, and fire insurance rating bureaus, and the regulation and 7 supervision of insurance carried by such companies, 8 9 associations, and exchanges, including insurance carried by 10 the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and repealing existing laws, " providing for scope of article, for 11 the definition of "long-term care insurance," for the Long-12 Term Care Partnership Program, for authority to promulgate 13 regulations, for marketing and advertising prohibited and for 14 15 penalties; and further providing for coverage and 16 limitations.
- 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 18 hereby enacts as follows:
- 19 Section 1. Section 1102 of the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682,
- 20 No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, added
- 21 December 15, 1992 (P.L.1129, No.148), is amended to read:
- 22 Section 1102. Scope of Article.--This article is not
- 23 intended to supersede the obligations of entities subject to

- 1 this article to comply with the substance of other applicable
- 2 insurance laws insofar as they do not conflict with this
- 3 article, except that laws and regulations designed and intended
- 4 to apply to Medicare supplement insurance policies shall not be
- 5 applied to long-term care insurance. A policy which is not
- 6 advertised, marketed or offered as long-term care insurance [or
- 7 nursing home insurance] need not meet the requirements of this
- 8 article.
- 9 Section 2. The definition of "long-term care insurance" in
- 10 section 1103 of the act, amended November 30, 2004 (P.L.1690,
- 11 No.216), is amended to read:
- 12 Section 1103. Definitions.--As used in this article, the
- 13 following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to
- 14 them in this section:
- 15 * * *
- 16 "Long-term care insurance." Any insurance policy or rider
- 17 advertised, marketed, offered or designed to provide
- 18 comprehensive coverage for each covered person on an expense-
- 19 incurred, indemnity, prepaid or other basis for functionally
- 20 necessary or medically necessary diagnostic, preventive,
- 21 therapeutic, rehabilitative, maintenance or personal care
- 22 services provided in a setting other than an acute care unit of
- 23 a hospital. The term includes a policy, rider or prepaid home
- 24 health or personal care service policy which provides for
- 25 payment of benefits based upon cognitive impairment or the loss
- 26 of functional capacity. The term includes group and individual
- 27 policies or riders issued by insurers, fraternal benefit
- 28 societies, nonprofit health, hospital and medical service
- 29 corporations, health maintenance organizations or similar
- 30 organizations. The term does not include any insurance policy

- 1 which is offered primarily to provide basic Medicare supplement
- 2 coverage, basic hospital expense coverage, basic medical-
- 3 surgical expense coverage, hospital confinement indemnity
- 4 coverage, major medical expense coverage, disability income
- 5 protection coverage, accident-only coverage, specified disease
- 6 or specified accident coverage or limited benefit health
- 7 coverage.
- 8 * * *
- 9 Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 10 <u>Section 1110.1. Long-Term Care Partnership Program.--(a)</u>
- 11 The Department of Public Welfare, with the cooperation of the
- 12 <u>department and the Department of Aging, shall seek to establish</u>
- 13 <u>a Long-Term Care Partnership Program by filing a State plan</u>
- 14 amendment within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this
- 15 <u>section with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services of</u>
- 16 the United States Department of Health and Human Services
- 17 pursuant to Title XIX of the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620,
- 18 42 U.S.C. § 301 et seq.).
- 19 (b) The department shall require all insurers to offer
- 20 OFFERING A QUALIFIED LONG-TERM CARE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM POLICY
- 21 to exchange any policy or certificate issued between February 8,
- 22 2006, and the date the State plan amendment takes effect, with a
- 23 qualified Long-Term Care Partnership Program policy. The
- 24 following shall apply:
- 25 (1) All offers of exchange shall be subject to the outline
- 26 of coverage provisions set forth under section 1111 and all
- 27 applicable regulations.
- 28 (2) Policies exchanged under this provision, if there is no
- 29 change in coverage material to the risk, shall not be subject to
- 30 <u>any medical underwriting or approval process.</u>

- 1 (3) Any portion of the policy that was issued prior to the
- 2 <u>exchange date shall be priced based on the policyholder's age</u>
- 3 when the policy was originally issued.
- 4 (4) Any portion of the policy that is added as a result of
- 5 the exchange may be priced based on the policyholder's age at
- 6 the time of the exchange.
- 7 (5) Any addition to a policy as a result of any exchange
- 8 shall be subject to the right to return set forth under section
- 9 1110 and all applicable regulations.
- 10 Section 4. Sections 1112, 1113 and 1114 of the act, added
- 11 December 15, 1992 (P.L.1129, No.148), are amended to read:
- 12 Section 1112. Authority to Promulgate Regulations. -- The
- 13 department shall promulgate reasonable regulations to establish
- 14 minimum standards for marketing practices, [agent] producer
- 15 compensation arrangements, [agent] <u>producer</u> testing, penalties
- 16 and reporting practices for long-term care insurance.
- 17 Section 1113. Marketing and Advertising Prohibited. -- No
- 18 policy may be advertised, marketed or offered as long-term care
- 19 [or nursing home] insurance unless it complies with the
- 20 provisions of this article.
- 21 Section 1114. Penalties. -- In addition to any other penalties
- 22 provided by the laws of this Commonwealth, an insurer or [agent]
- 23 producer found to have violated requirements relating to the
- 24 regulations of long-term care insurance or the marketing of such
- 25 insurance shall be subject to a civil penalty of up to three
- 26 times the amount of any commissions paid for each policy
- 27 involved in the violation or ten thousand dollars (\$10,000),
- 28 whichever is greater.
- 29 Section 5. Section 1703 of the act, added December 18, 1992
- 30 (P.L.1519, No.178), is amended to read:

- 1 Section 1703. Coverage and Limitations.--(a) This article
- 2 shall provide coverage to the following persons for the policies
- 3 and contracts specified in subsection (b):
- 4 (1) To persons who, regardless of where they reside, except
- 5 for nonresident certificate holders under group policies or
- 6 contracts, are the beneficiaries, assignees or payees of the
- 7 persons covered under paragraph (2).
- 8 (2) To persons who are owners of or certificate holders
- 9 under these policies or contracts or, in the case of unallocated
- 10 annuity contracts, to the persons who are the contract holders
- 11 and who:
- 12 (i) are residents; or
- 13 (ii) are not residents, but only under all of the following
- 14 conditions:
- 15 (A) the insurers which issued such policies or contracts are
- 16 domiciled in this Commonwealth;
- 17 (B) such insurers never held a license or certificate of
- 18 authority in the states in which such persons reside;
- 19 (C) these states have associations similar to the
- 20 association created by this article; and
- 21 (D) these persons are not eligible for coverage by those
- 22 associations.
- 23 (b) (1) This article shall provide coverage to the persons
- 24 specified in subsection (a) for direct, nongroup life, health,
- 25 annuity and supplemental policies or contracts, for certificates
- 26 under direct group policies and contracts and for unallocated
- 27 annuity contracts issued by member insurers, except as limited
- 28 by this article. Annuity contracts and certificates under group
- 29 annuity contracts include, but are not limited to, guaranteed
- 30 investment contracts, deposit administration contracts,

- 1 unallocated funding agreements, allocated funding agreements,
- 2 structured settlement agreements, lottery contracts and any
- 3 immediate or deferred annuity contracts.
- 4 (2) This article shall not provide coverage for any of the
- 5 following:
- 6 (i) Any portion of a policy or contract not guaranteed by
- 7 the insurer or under which the risk is borne by the policy or
- 8 contract holder.
- 9 (ii) Any policy or contract of reinsurance, unless
- 10 assumption certificates have been issued.
- 11 (iii) Any portion of a policy or contract to the extent that
- 12 the rate of interest on which it is based:
- 13 (A) averaged over the period of four (4) years prior to the
- 14 date on which the association becomes obligated with respect to
- 15 such policy or contract, exceeds a rate of interest determined
- 16 by subtracting two (2) percentage points from Moody's Corporate
- 17 Bond Yield Average averaged for the same four-year period or for
- 18 such lesser period if the policy or contract was issued less
- 19 than four (4) years before the association became obligated; and
- 20 (B) on and after the date on which the association becomes
- 21 obligated with respect to such policy or contract, exceeds the
- 22 rate of interest determined by subtracting three (3) percentage
- 23 points from Moody's Corporate Bond Yield Average as most
- 24 recently available.
- 25 (iv) Any plan or program of an employer, association or
- 26 similar entity to provide life, health or annuity benefits to
- 27 its employes or members to the extent that such plan or program
- 28 is self-funded or uninsured, including, but not limited to,
- 29 benefits payable by an employer, association or similar entity
- 30 under:

- 1 (A) a Multiple Employer Welfare Arrangement as defined in
- 2 section 514 of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of
- 3 1974;
- 4 (B) a minimum premium group insurance plan;
- 5 (C) a stop-loss group insurance plan; or
- 6 (D) an administrative services only contract.
- 7 (v) Any portion of a policy or contract to the extent that
- 8 it provides dividends or experience rating credits or provides
- 9 that any fees or allowances to be paid to any person, including
- 10 the policyholder or contract holder, in connection with the
- 11 service to or administration of such policy or contract.
- 12 (vi) Any policy or contract issued in this Commonwealth by a
- 13 member insurer at a time when it was not licensed or did not
- 14 have a certificate of authority to issue such policy or contract
- 15 in this Commonwealth.
- 16 (vii) Any unallocated annuity contract issued to an employe
- 17 benefit plan protected under the Federal Pension Benefit
- 18 Guaranty Corporation.
- 19 (viii) Any portion of any unallocated annuity contract which
- 20 is not issued to or in connection with a specific employe, union
- 21 or association of natural persons benefit plan or a government
- 22 lottery.
- 23 (c) (1) The benefits for which the association may become
- 24 liable shall in no event exceed the lesser of:
- 25 (i) the contractual obligations for which the insurer is
- 26 liable or would have been liable if it were not an impaired or
- 27 insolvent insurer; or
- 28 (ii) (A) With respect to any one life, regardless of the
- 29 number of policies or contracts, the following shall apply:
- 30 (I) Three hundred thousand (\$300,000) dollars in life

- 1 insurance death benefits, but not more than one hundred thousand
- 2 (\$100,000) dollars in net cash surrender and net cash withdrawal
- 3 values for life insurance.
- 4 (II) [One hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars] Three hundred
- 5 thousand (\$300,000) dollars in health insurance benefits,
- 6 including any net cash surrender and net cash withdrawal values.
- 7 (III) Three hundred thousand (\$300,000) dollars in annuity
- 8 benefits, including one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars in
- 9 net cash surrender and net cash withdrawal values.
- 10 (IV) Three hundred thousand (\$300,000) dollars in long-term
- 11 care insurance benefits, as defined under section 1103,
- 12 including any cash surrender and net cash withdrawal values.
- 13 (B) With respect to each individual participating in a
- 14 governmental retirement plan established under section 401,
- 15 403(b) or 457 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 covered by an
- 16 unallocated annuity contract or the beneficiaries of each such
- 17 individual if deceased, in the aggregate, three hundred thousand
- 18 (\$300,000) dollars in annuity benefits, including one hundred
- 19 thousand (\$100,000) dollars in net cash surrender and net cash
- 20 withdrawal values.
- 21 (C) With respect to any one contract holder covered by any
- 22 unallocated annuity contract not included in clause (B), five
- 23 million (\$5,000,000) dollars in benefits, irrespective of the
- 24 number of such contracts held by that contract holder.
- 25 (2) The association shall not, however, be liable to expend
- 26 more than three hundred thousand (\$300,000) dollars in the
- 27 aggregate with respect to any one individual under subparagraph
- 28 (ii)(A) and (B) of paragraph (1).
- Section 6. The amendment of section 1703(c)(1)(ii)(A)(II)
- 30 and (IV) shall apply to an insolvency occurring on or after the

- 1 effective date of this section.
- SECTION 7. THE AMENDMENT OF SECTION 1103 OF THE ACT SHALL <---2
- 3 APPLY TO ALL POLICIES ISSUED ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF
- 4 THIS ACT.
- 5 Section 7 8. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 6 (1) Section 6 SECTIONS 5 AND 6 OF THIS ACT and this
- 7 section shall take effect immediately.
- (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60 8
- 9 days.
