## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Pennsylvania Youth Commission; and providing
- for powers and duties, for report to the General Assembly and
- 3 for Pennsylvania Youth Commission Scholarship.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 8 Youth Commission Act.
- 9 Section 2. Declaration of policy
- 10 (a) Findings and declarations. -- The General Assembly finds
- 11 and declares as follows:
- 12 (1) Public office is a public trust between elected
- officials and the citizens they represent.
- 14 (2) Despite age or voting record, each individual
- residing in this Commonwealth is part of the public trust.

1 (3) Voting is the foremost means of direct participation 2 in government for the citizenry. Youth under 18 years of age 3 are not yet eligible to vote, and the youngest eligible 4 voters between 18 and 24 years of age consistently produce

the lowest number of voters.

- 6 (4) The ability and responsibility of the citizenry to
  7 participate in the political process is a foundation of our
  8 government and an issue of utmost significance. In order to
  9 maintain a lasting knowledgeable and participatory electorate
  10 and the full functionality of the political process and the
  11 public trust, additional focus should be placed on the youth
- 13 (5) As each generation moves forward, a new generation
  14 of voters will become eligible to participate directly in the
  15 democratic process, necessitating the call for a body that
  16 will serve as the conduit to awareness, understanding and
  17 participation in our government, its decisions and its
  18 importance.
- 19 (6) The creation of a body that will focus directly on 20 the issues and concerns facing forthcoming participants in 21 the democratic process of this Commonwealth will result in 22 numerous and positive outcomes.
- 23 (b) Legislative intent.--It is the intent of the General
- 24 Assembly that this act provide for and enhance the awareness,
- 25 understanding and participation of the youth of this
- 26 Commonwealth in the democratic process through a means separate
- 27 from the ability to vote. It is the further intent of the
- 28 General Assembly to establish a commission that will empower
- 29 youth who are not yet eligible to vote. Through this commission,
- 30 it is the intent of the General Assembly to tap the invaluable

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- 1 resource of young minds and ideas that have been consistently
- 2 disassociated with public officials, government and the status
- 3 quo of the political process, and in turn produce involved
- 4 citizens, leaders and pillars of young adulthood.
- 5 Section 3. Definitions.
- 6 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 7 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 8 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 9 "Commission." The Pennsylvania Youth Commission established
- 10 under this act.
- 11 "Director." The director of the Pennsylvania Youth
- 12 Commission.
- 13 "Representative." A youth representative selected under
- 14 section 7.
- 15 Section 4. Pennsylvania Youth Commission.
- 16 (a) Purpose. -- The Pennsylvania Youth Commission is hereby
- 17 established to recognize and empower the voices of youth and
- 18 youth leaders throughout this Commonwealth. Through the
- 19 commission, the ideas and concerns of this Commonwealth's youth
- 20 shall be delivered to the General Assembly in a constructive and
- 21 organized method. Youth members shall collect, evaluate and
- 22 report the issues, concerns and ideas of the youth across this
- 23 Commonwealth to create a proactive means of participation in
- 24 State government.
- 25 (b) Appointment and terms of members.--The commission shall
- 26 consist of nine members, two members each appointed by the
- 27 President pro tempore and the Minority Leader of the Senate and
- 28 two members each appointed by the Majority Leader and the
- 29 Minority Leader of the House of Representatives. Each appointee
- 30 shall serve a term of four years. The ninth member of the

- 1 commission shall be a youth member. The youth member shall be
- 2 one of the 50 youth representatives, selected under section 7,
- 3 who is elected by a majority of the youth representatives. The
- 4 youth member of the commission shall take office one year after
- 5 the effective date of this act. A member shall be 40 years of
- 6 age or younger at the time of appointment, and may serve the
- 7 remainder of his or her term should the member reach age 41
- 8 during the member's term.
- 9 (c) Director.--The position of director of the commission is
- 10 created for the purpose of administering the Pennsylvania Youth
- 11 Commission. The director shall be the chief administrator of all
- 12 guidelines, policies and initiatives set forth by the commission
- 13 and shall be responsible for maintenance and distribution of the
- 14 budget.
- 15 Section 5. Powers and duties of commission.
- 16 The commission shall have the following powers and duties:
- 17 (1) Appoint a director of the commission who shall serve
- at the pleasure of the commission.
- 19 (2) Solicit donations and sponsors, in addition to any
- 20 State appropriation, for expenses of the commission.
- 21 (3) Establish ten regions throughout this Commonwealth
- of equal population and reasonable geography.
- 23 (4) Create and distribute a youth representative
- 24 application and promulgate guidelines for the acceptance and
- confidential review of the applications.
- 26 (5) Annually select the recipient of the Pennsylvania
- 27 Youth Commission Scholarship, as provided under section
- section 9.
- 29 (6) Promulgate rules and regulations to administer this
- 30 act.

- 1 Section 6. Prohibited activities.
- 2 A commissioner shall not do any of the following:
- 3 (1) Receive monetary compensation for service as a
- 4 commissioner.
- 5 (2) Require any representative to participate in any
- form of campaign activity or establish any form of punishment
- 7 for refusal to participate.
- 8 (3) Use an event, meeting or activity of the commission
- 9 as a tool for campaigning or a means to deliver campaign
- 10 rhetoric.
- 11 Section 7. Youth representatives.
- 12 (a) Number of representatives.--There shall be 50 youth
- 13 representatives to the commission, consisting of five youth
- 14 selected from each of the ten geographical regions of this
- 15 Commonwealth as established by the commission. Each region shall
- 16 be represented by at least one member of each sex.
- 17 (b) Selection and eligibility.--The commissioners, in
- 18 consultation with the director, shall select the youth
- 19 representatives. Each youth representative shall exemplify the
- 20 characteristics set forth by the commission. A representative
- 21 shall not be younger than 13 years of age or older than 18 years
- 22 of age.
- 23 (c) Term.--A representative may serve until the end of the
- 24 calendar year in which the representative reaches his or her
- 25 18th birthday.
- 26 (d) Attendance.--The commission shall establish a policy
- 27 regarding the frequency of and attendance by representatives at
- 28 regional and Statewide representative meetings. There shall be
- 29 not less than four regional representative meetings and one
- 30 Statewide representative meeting per year.

- 1 (e) Resignation or removal. -- A representative may be
- 2 relieved of his or her position as follows:
- 3 (1) Upon approval by the commissioners of a
- 4 representative's request that he or she be excused.
- 5 (2) Upon a decision of the commission to remove the
- 6 representative.
- 7 Section 8. Report to General Assembly.
- 8 Each calendar year, the youth member of the commission shall
- 9 separately address the Senate and the House of Representatives
- 10 on the floor during a regular session. This youth member's
- 11 address to the General Assembly shall be a comprehensive annual
- 12 report on the activities, concerns and ideas of the Pennsylvania
- 13 Youth Commission and an opportunity for members of the General
- 14 Assembly to receive and consider the input of the youth who are
- 15 the future of this Commonwealth.
- 16 Section 9. Pennsylvania Youth Commission Scholarship.
- 17 (a) Award. -- The commission shall annually award a
- 18 scholarship to one of the 50 youth representatives to the
- 19 commission.
- 20 (b) Selection of recipient. -- The director shall annually
- 21 identify and submit a list to the commission members of five
- 22 youth representatives who consistently demonstrate leadership
- 23 and exemplary service to the commission. The commission members
- 24 shall select one of the five candidates submitted by the
- 25 director to receive the award.
- 26 (c) Amount.--The scholarship shall be no less than \$5,000
- 27 and shall be presented to the recipient during a Statewide
- 28 meeting of the youth representatives.
- 29 Section 10. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
