AN ACT

- 1 Providing for sexual violence awareness education programs for
- new students matriculating to institutions of higher
- 3 education or private licensed schools that receive public
- funding and for duties of the Department of Education.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the College and
- 9 University Sexual Violence Education Act.
- 10 Section 2. Legislative findings.
- 11 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 12 (1) It is in the interest of the Commonwealth to
- 13 facilitate the education of its young people.
- 14 (2) Awareness and education are the beginning steps to
- 15 prevention.
- 16 (3) Education is imperative to promoting safety and

- 1 raising awareness of sexual violence among young people.
- 2 (4) The first few months of the freshman year are the
- 3 most dangerous for new female and male college students
- 4 because of the availability of drugs and alcohol, the absence
- of parental supervision and a lack of awareness of sexual
- 6 violence.
- 7 Section 3. Definitions.
- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 9 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 12 Commonwealth.
- "Education program." A sexual violence education program
- 14 under this act.
- 15 "Institution of higher education." An independent
- 16 institution of higher education, a community college, a State-
- 17 related institution or a member institution of the State System
- 18 of Higher Education.
- 19 "Matriculating." Enrolling in an institution of higher
- 20 education or private licensed school.
- 21 "Private licensed school." As defined in the act of December
- 22 15, 1986 (P.L.1585, No.174), known as the Private Licensed
- 23 Schools Act.
- "Sexual Violence." As defined in 42 Pa.C.S. § 6402 (relating
- 25 to definitions).
- 26 "Student." A person who is enrolled on a full-time basis at
- 27 an institution of higher education or private licensed school.
- 28 Section 4. Purpose.
- 29 The purpose of the education program is to increase awareness
- 30 of and improve every student's understanding of sexual violence

- 1 and to reduce the likelihood of sexual violence.
- 2 Section 5. Education program.
- 3 (a) General rule. -- Institutions of higher education and
- 4 private licensed schools shall establish a sexual violence
- 5 awareness educational program. Institutions of higher education
- 6 and private licensed schools may collaborate with a Statewide
- 7 nonprofit organization, local rape crisis center or local sexual
- 8 assault program that arranges for the provision of services to
- 9 sexual violence and rape victims in the development of a sexual
- 10 violence awareness educational program. Each educational program
- 11 shall provide the following:
- 12 (1) A discussion of sexual violence.
- 13 (2) A discussion of consent, including an explanation
- 14 that the victim is not at fault.
- 15 (3) A discussion of drug and alcohol-facilitated sexual
- 16 violence.
- 17 (4) Information relating to risk education and personal
- 18 protection.
- 19 (5) Information on where and how to get assistance,
- 20 including the importance of medical treatment and evidence
- 21 collection, and how to report sexual violence to campus
- 22 authorities and local law enforcement.
- 23 (6) The possibility of pregnancy and transmission of
- 24 sexual diseases.
- 25 (7) Introduction of members of the educational community
- 26 from:
- 27 (i) Campus police or security and local law
- enforcement.
- 29 (ii) Campus health center, women's center and rape
- 30 crisis center.

- 1 (iii) Campus counseling service or any service
- 2 responsible for psychological counseling and student
- 3 affairs.
- 4 (8) A promise of discretion and dignity.
- 5 (9) A promise of confidentiality for victims of sexual
- 6 assault.
- 7 (b) Student bill of rights. -- Consistent with the campus
- 8 sexual assault victims' bill of rights under section 485(f)(8)
- 9 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-329, 20
- 10 U.S.C. § 1092(f)(8)), a student bill of rights shall be made
- 11 available to students.
- 12 Section 6. Follow-up.
- 13 An institution of higher education and private licensed
- 14 school shall conduct a follow-up program for the duration of the
- 15 school year for new students. The program may consist of the
- 16 following:
- 17 (1) Lecturers relating to sexual violence prevention and
- awareness.
- 19 (2) Institutional activities relating to sexual violence
- 20 prevention and awareness.
- 21 (3) Videos and other educational materials relating to
- 22 sexual violence prevention and awareness.
- 23 Section 7. Duties of department.
- 24 The department shall:
- 25 (1) Ensure compliance with this act.
- 26 (2) Solicit the cooperation of other agencies,
- institutions and organizations, both public and private, in
- 28 carrying out the provisions of this act.
- 29 (3) Otherwise administer the provisions of this act.
- 30 Section 8. Report.

- 1 An institution of higher education and a private licensed
- 2 school shall report to the department on the implementation of
- 3 the education program by the institution or school.
- 4 Section 9. Effective date.
- 5 This act shall take effect in 120 days JULY 1, 2008, OR <--
- 6 IMMEDIATELY, WHICHEVER IS LATER.
