## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11	Amending the act of September 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39), entitled "An act establishing salaries and compensation of certain public officials including justices and judges of Statewide courts, judges of courts of common pleas, judges of the Philadelphia Municipal Court, judges of the Philadelphia Traffic Court, district justices and the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the State Treasurer, the Auditor General, the Attorney General and certain other State officers and the salary and certain expenses of the members of the General Assembly; and repealing certain inconsistent acts," providing for commission on salaries and benefits for elected officials and duties of commission.
13	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14	hereby enacts as follows:
15	Section 1. The act of September 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39),
16	known as the Public Official Compensation Law, is amended by
17	adding sections to read:
18	Section 4.1. Commission on Salaries and Benefits for Elected
19	Officials.
20	(a) EstablishmentThere is established a commission to be
21	known as the Commission on Salaries and Benefits for Elected
22	Officials. The commission shall consist of members chosen at

- 1 random from the voter rolls of each congressional district.
- 2 (b) Composition. -- The commission members shall be selected
- 3 by lot by the Secretary of State from among those registered
- 4 <u>voters eligible to vote at the time persons are selected for</u>
- 5 appointment to full terms on the commission under subsection
- 6 (d). One member shall be selected from each congressional
- 7 <u>district to serve on the commission</u>. Another person shall be
- 8 <u>selected to serve as an alternate. The secretary shall establish</u>
- 9 policies and procedures for conducting the selection by lot.
- 10 (c) Policies and procedures. -- The policies and procedures
- 11 shall include, but not be limited to, notifying persons selected
- 12 and for providing a new selection from a congressional district
- 13 <u>if a person selected from the district declines appointment to</u>
- 14 the commission or if, following the person's appointment, the
- 15 person's position on the commission becomes vacant before the
- 16 <u>end of the person's term of office.</u>
- 17 <u>(d) Terms.--All members shall serve four-year terms.</u>
- 18 (e) Term limits and removal.--No person may be appointed to
- 19 more than two terms. No member of the commission may be removed
- 20 <u>during his or her term of office unless for cause of incapacity,</u>
- 21 <u>incompetence</u>, <u>neglect of duty</u>, <u>malfeasance in office or for a</u>
- 22 disqualifying change of residence.
- 23 (f) Code of conduct.--
- 24 (1) A member of the commission shall:
- 25 (i) Not engage in any exparte communication with
- 26 <u>any public officials, including justices and judges of</u>
- 27 Statewide courts, judges of courts of common pleas,
- 28 <u>judges of the Philadelphia Municipal Court, judges of the</u>
- 29 <u>Philadelphia Traffic Court, district justices, the</u>
- 30 Governor, the <u>Lieutenant Governor</u>, the <u>State Treasurer</u>,

1 the Auditor General, the Attorney General and other State officers, members of the General Assembly, legislator, 2. 3 judge or other individual whose salary or benefits or a portion thereof is determined by the provisions of this 4 5 act. (ii) Not engage in any exparte communication with a 6 person acting on his own behalf or on behalf of an 7 official subject to the provisions of subparagraph (i). 8 (iii) Not solicit funds for any charitable, 9 educational, religious, health, fraternal, civic or other 10 11 nonprofit entity from a person subject to the provisions of subparagraph (i) or (ii). A commission member may 12 13 serve as an officer, employee or member of the governing 14 body of a nonprofit entity and may attend, make personal contributions to and plan or preside over the entity's 15 fundraising events. A commission member may permit his 16 name to appear on the letterhead used for fundraising 17 18 events if the letterhead contains only the commission member's name and position with the nonprofit entity. 19 20 (iv) Not meet or engage in discussions with an individual subject to the provisions of subparagraph (i) 21 22 or (ii) unless the meeting or discussion occurs on the business premises of the commission and is recorded in a 23 log maintained for this purpose. The log shall be 2.4 available for public inspection during the regular 25 business hours of the commission. 26 27 (v) Avoid impropriety and the appearance of 28 impropriety at all times and observe standards and conduct that promote public confidence in the oversight 29

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of salary or benefit increases and decreases for public

- 1 <u>officials employed in this Commonwealth.</u>
- 2 (2) As used in this subsection, the following words and
- 3 <u>phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this</u>
- 4 <u>paragraph:</u>
- 5 <u>"Member." An individual appointed to and sworn in as a</u>
- 6 member of the commission in accordance with section 4.1(a).
- 7 <u>"Person." Any natural person, corporation, foundation,</u>
- 8 organization, business trust, estate, limited liability
- 9 <u>company</u>, <u>licensed corporation</u>, <u>trust</u>, <u>partnership</u>, <u>limited</u>
- 10 <u>liability partnership, association or any other form of legal</u>
- 11 <u>business entity.</u>
- 12 (q) Absences.--The unexcused absence of any person who is a
- 13 member of the commission from two consecutive meetings of the
- 14 commission shall constitute the relinquishment of that person's
- 15 membership on the commission. Such a relinquishment creates a
- 16 <u>vacancy in that person's position on the commission. A member's</u>
- 17 absence may be excused by the chair of the commission upon the
- 18 member's written request if the chair believes there is just
- 19 cause for the absence. Such a request must be received by the
- 20 chair before the meeting for which the absence is to be excused.
- 21 <u>A member's absence from a meeting of the commission may also be</u>
- 22 excused during the meeting for which the member is absent by the
- 23 affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the commission
- 24 present at the meeting.
- 25 (h) Eligibility. -- No State official, public employee,
- 26 <u>lobbyist or immediate family member of the official, employee or</u>
- 27 lobbyist, subject to the registration requirements of 65 Pa.C.S.
- 28 Ch. 13A (relating to lobbying disclosure) is eligible for
- 29 membership on the commission. As used in this subsection, the
- 30 phrase "immediate family" means the parents, spouse, siblings,

- 1 children or dependent relative of the official, employee or
- 2 <u>lobbyist whether or not living in the household of the official,</u>
- 3 <u>employee or lobbyist.</u>
- 4 (i) Alternates.--The candidate chosen from the voter rolls
- 5 not serving on the commission shall serve as an alternate. The
- 6 <u>alternate shall succeed a commission member vacating his</u>
- 7 position. Once an alternate begins serving on the commission,
- 8 the Secretary of State shall initiate the procedure to randomly
- 9 <u>select another person to serve as an alternate.</u>
- 10 (j) Definition. -- As used in this section, the term "benefit"
- 11 shall include, but not be limited to, compensation including
- 12 pension, health care and per diems.
- 13 Section 4.2. Duties of Commission on Salaries and Benefits for
- 14 Elected Officials.
- 15 <u>(a) Salary study.--The Commission on Salaries and Benefits</u>
- 16 for Elected Officials established in section 4.1 shall study the
- 17 relationship of salaries to the duties of members of the General
- 18 Assembly, all elected officials of the executive branch of State
- 19 government and all judges of the Supreme Court, court of
- 20 appeals, superior courts and district courts and shall fix the
- 21 <u>salary for each respective position</u>.
- 22 (b) Organization and operation. -- Except as provided
- 23 otherwise by this section and section 4.1, the commission shall
- 24 be solely responsible for its own organization, operation and
- 25 action and shall enjoy the fullest cooperation of all State
- 26 officials, departments and agencies.
- 27 (c) Prohibition.--The commission shall not reduce salaries
- 28 <u>or benefits during terms of office.</u>
- 29 <u>(d) Compensation of members.--Members of the commission</u>
- 30 shall receive no compensation for their services, but shall be

- 1 <u>eligible to receive a subsistence allowance and travel expenses.</u>
- 2 (e) Selection of chair. -- The members of the commission shall
- 3 <u>elect a chair from among their number.</u>
- 4 (f) Salary and benefits schedule and voting. -- The commission
- 5 shall set a schedule of salaries and benefits by an affirmative
- 6 vote of not less than 11 members of the commission.
- 7 (g) Filing of initial schedule. -- The commission shall file
- 8 its initial schedule of salaries and benefits for the elected
- 9 <u>officials with the Secretary of State no later than the first</u>
- 10 Monday in June, 2008, and shall file a schedule biennially
- 11 <u>thereafter</u>. Each schedule shall be filed in legislative bill
- 12 form, shall be assigned a chapter number and published with the
- 13 <u>session laws of the General Assembly. The signature of the chair</u>
- 14 of the commission shall be affixed to each schedule submitted to
- 15 the Secretary of State. The chair shall certify that the
- 16 <u>schedule has been adopted in accordance with the provisions of</u>
- 17 State law and with the rules, if any, of the commission. The
- 18 schedules shall become effective 60 days after the filing.
- 19 (h) Meetings.--Before the filing of any salary and benefits
- 20 <u>schedule</u>, the commission shall first develop a proposed salary
- 21 and benefits schedule and then hold no fewer than four meetings
- 22 to take public testimony on the proposed schedule within the
- 23 four months immediately preceding the filing. At the last public
- 24 hearing that is held as a regular meeting on the proposed
- 25 schedule, the commission shall adopt the originally proposed or
- 26 <u>amended salary and benefits schedule, which will be filed with</u>
- 27 the Secretary of State. All meetings, actions, hearings and
- 28 <u>business of the commission shall be subject to 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7</u>
- 29 <u>(relating to open meetings).</u>
- 30 (i) Current salaries and benefits. -- Salaries, benefits, and

- 1 cost-of-living increases of the officials referred to in
- 2 <u>subsection (a) shall continue until modified by the commission</u>
- 3 <u>under this section.</u>
- 4 (j) Increases and decreases. -- In fixing salaries or
- 5 benefits, a majority of the commission must vote in the
- 6 <u>affirmative for the increase or decrease. The commission shall</u>
- 7 not increase or reduce salaries or benefits by more than 10%.
- 8 (k) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "benefit"
- 9 shall include, but not be limited to, compensation including
- 10 pension, health care and per diems.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
