AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 12 (Commerce and Trade) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for film production
- 3 grants.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Sections 4102, 4103, 4104, 4105, 4106 and 4108 of
- 7 Title 12 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended
- 8 to read:
- 9 § 4102. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 11 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Applicant." A person that files a notice and application in
- 14 accordance with this chapter.
- 15 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 16 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 17 "Film." The term includes a feature film, television film,
- 18 television pilot or [each episode of] a television series which

- 1 is intended as programming for a national audience, in each case
- 2 with a budget of less than \$2,000,000. The term does not include
- 3 a production featuring:
- 4 (1) News, current events, weather and market reports.
- 5 (2) Public programming.
- 6 (3) Talk shows, game shows, sports events, awards shows
- 7 or other gala events.
- 8 (4) A production that solicits funds.
- 9 (5) A production that primarily markets a product or
- 10 service.
- 11 (6) A production containing obscene material or
- performances as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 5903(b) (relating to
- obscene and other sexual materials and performances).
- 14 (7) A production primarily for private, political,
- industrial, corporate or institutional purposes.
- 16 "Pennsylvania production expense." A production expense
- 17 incurred in this Commonwealth. For the purposes of wages and
- 18 salaries, the term includes only wages and salaries on which the
- 19 taxes imposed by Article III or IV of the act of March 4, 1971
- 20 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, have been
- 21 paid or accrued.
- 22 "Production expense."
- 23 (1) An expense incurred in the production of a film. The
- 24 term includes:
- 25 (i) The aggregate amount of wages and salaries of
- individuals each of whom receive less than \$1,000,000 and
- are employed in the production of the film.
- 28 (ii) The costs of construction, operations, editing,
- 29 photography, sound synchronization, lighting, wardrobe
- 30 and accessories.

1	(iii) [The cost of rental facilities and equipment.]
2	(Reserved).
3	(iv) The cost of transportation to or from a
4	Pennsylvania train station, bus depot or airport.
5	(v) The purchase of music or story rights if the
6	purchase price is under \$1,000,000, the rights are
7	purchased from a Pennsylvania resident or an entity
8	subject to taxation in this Commonwealth and the
9	transaction is subject to taxation under Article III, IV
10	or VI of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as
11	the Tax Reform Code of 1971.
12	(vi) The cost of leasing vehicles.
13	(vii) The cost of insurance coverage if the
14	insurance is purchased through a Pennsylvania-based
15	insurance agent.
16	(viii) The costs of food and lodging.
17	(ix) Any other costs the department deems advisable
18	to include.
19	(2) The term does not include [expenses incurred in
20	<pre>purchasing story rights, music rights,] development costs[,]</pre>
21	or expenses incurred in marketing or advertising a film.
22	"Program." The Film Production Grant Program established in
23	section 4103 (relating to establishment).
24	"Qualified film production expense." A Pennsylvania
25	production expense if at least 60% of the total production
26	expenses are Pennsylvania production expenses.
27	"Recipient." A person who receives a grant under this
28	chapter.
29	"Start date." The first day of principal photography in this

30 Commonwealth.

- 1 § 4103. Establishment.
- 2 There is established within the department a program to be
- 3 known as the Film Production Grant Program. The program shall be
- 4 administered by the department to provide grants to persons for
- 5 [certain] films produced within this Commonwealth.
- 6 § 4104. Application.
- 7 [At any time prior to 60 days after the completion of
- 8 production of a film, a person may submit an application for a
- 9 film production grant to the department. The application shall
- 10 be on a form required by the department and shall include or
- 11 demonstrate all of the following:]
- 12 (a) Notice.--Prior to commencing production of a film, a
- 13 person desiring to apply for a grant for a Pennsylvania film
- 14 production under subsection (b) shall submit a notice to the
- 15 <u>department informing it of the person's intention to apply for</u>
- 16 the grant. The notice shall be on the form required by the
- 17 department and shall include or demonstrate all of the
- 18 following:
- 19 (1) An itemized list of production expenses incurred or
- 20 to be incurred during the current <u>Commonwealth</u> fiscal year
- and the anticipated expenses to be incurred for any
- 22 subsequent <u>Commonwealth fiscal</u> year if the film production is
- anticipated to extend into any such year.
- 24 (2) An itemized list of Pennsylvania production expenses
- 25 incurred.
- 26 (3) The start date.
- 27 (4) The actual or projected completion date.
- 28 (5) A statement of the amount of grant sought.
- 29 (6) Any other information required by the department.
- 30 (b) Application.--Within 60 days of the completion of

- 1 production of a film, the applicant shall file an application
- 2 for a film production grant with the department. The application
- 3 shall be on a form required by the department and shall include
- 4 <u>or demonstrate all of the following:</u>
- 5 (1) An itemized list of production expenses actually
- 6 <u>incurred</u>.
- 7 (2) An itemized list of Pennsylvania production expenses
- 8 actually incurred. Expenses submitted under this paragraph
- 9 <u>may not in the aggregate exceed the amount of projected</u>
- 10 expenses submitted to the department under subsection (a)(2).
- 11 (3) The date of the completion of production of the
- 12 <u>film.</u>
- 13 (4) Any other information required by the department.
- 14 § 4105. Review.
- 15 The department shall review the application to determine if
- 16 the applicant has met all of the criteria set forth in section
- 17 4104 (relating to application)[.] and in the guidelines
- 18 developed by the department under section 4109 (relating to
- 19 quidelines).
- 20 § 4106. Approval.
- 21 The following shall apply:
- 22 (1) Upon being satisfied that all requirements have been
- 23 met and subject to section 4108 (relating to limitations),
- the department may approve the application and award a film
- 25 production grant to the applicant.
- 26 (2) Prior to providing grant funds to the applicant, the
- 27 department shall enter into a contract with the applicant.
- 28 The contract shall include provisions requiring the applicant
- 29 to use the grant to pay costs associated with the production
- 30 of the film.

- 1 (3) The department may impose any other terms and
- 2 conditions on the grants authorized by this chapter as the
- 3 department determines are in the best interests of the
- 4 Commonwealth.
- 5 § 4108. Limitations.
- 6 The following limitations shall apply:
- 7 (1) A recipient may not receive a grant under this
- 8 <u>chapter for more than one year for the same film.</u>
- 9 [(1)] (2) A grant awarded under this chapter to an
- 10 applicant for a film may not exceed 20% of the qualified film
- 11 production expenses incurred for the film.
- [(2)] (3) In no case shall the aggregate amount of
- grants awarded in any fiscal year under this chapter exceed
- 14 [\$10,000,000] \$15,000,000.
- [(3)] (4) A grant awarded under this chapter shall in no
- way constitute an entitlement derived from the Commonwealth
- or a claim on any other funds of the Commonwealth.
- 18 (5) An applicant who has been awarded a film production
- tax credit under any provision of the act of March 4, 1971
- 20 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, shall
- 21 <u>not be eliqible to receive a grant under this chapter for the</u>
- 22 same film.
- 23 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
