## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for powers and
- duties of Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training
- 4 Commission.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 2164 of Title 53 of the Pennsylvania
- 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 9 § 2164. Powers and duties of commission.
- 10 The powers and duties of the commission shall be as follows:
- 11 (1) To establish and administer the minimum courses of
- 12 study for basic and in-service training for police officers
- 13 and to revoke an officer's certification when an officer
- fails to comply with the basic and in-service training
- 15 requirements or is convicted of a criminal offense or the
- 16 commission determines that the officer is physically or
- 17 mentally unfit to perform the duties of his office or
- determines that a police officer subject to section 2166.1

- 1 (relating to prohibition on political activity) has engaged 2 or participated in the conducting of political or election 3 campaign activity in violation of that section.
- 4 (2) To approve or revoke the approval of any school 5 which may be utilized to comply with the educational and 6 training requirements as established by the commission.
  - (3) To establish the minimum qualifications for instructors, to approve or revoke the approval of any instructor and to develop the requirements for continued certification.
- 11 (4) To promote the most efficient and economical program
  12 for police training by utilizing existing facilities,
  13 programs and qualified Federal, State and local police
  14 personnel.
  - (5) To make an annual report to the Governor and to the General Assembly concerning the administration of the Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Program and the activities of the commission, together with recommendations for executive or legislative action necessary for the improvement of law enforcement and the administration of justice.
- 22 (6) To require every police officer to attend a minimum
  23 number of hours of in-service training as provided for by
  24 regulation, unless the officer's employer files a show cause
  25 document with the commission requesting additional time for
  26 the officer to comply with the in-service training
  27 requirements. Approval of this request shall be made by the
  28 commission on a case-by-case basis.
- 29 (7) To require all police officers to undergo a 30 background investigation to determine the individual's

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1 suitability for employment as a police officer. This 2 investigation shall be completed prior to the employment of 3 the officer and shall include a criminal history check, a

4 credit check, personal interviews and any other applicable

5 means of determining eligibility. An applicant who has been

convicted of a felony or serious misdemeanor shall not be

eligible for employment as a police officer.

- To require minimum standards for physical fitness, visual acuity, audio acuity, psychological evaluation and education as prerequisites to employment as a police officer. The standards shall require an applicant to have audio acuity sufficient to distinguish a normal whisper at a distance of 15 feet. The test shall be independently conducted for each ear while the tested ear is facing away from the speaker and the other ear is firmly covered with the palm of the hand. If the applicant fails this test, the applicant shall be required to take and pass a decibel audio test. The applicant may use a hearing aid or other aid to perform any audio acuity test required under this subsection.
- To appoint an executive director to administer the training program established by this subchapter. The position 21 22 of executive director shall be filled by the commission which 23 shall select the best qualified person from a list of three 24 persons nominated by the chairman. The person who receives a 25 simple majority of those members present and voting shall become the executive director. If the commission rejects all 26 27 nominees, then the process shall be repeated until a person 28 is selected. The executive director shall be directly 29 responsible to the commission and may be dismissed only by two-thirds vote of the commission. The executive director 30

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- shall employ a sufficient staff, including professional,
- 2 administrative and clerical personnel, to perform the tasks
- of the office, including the preparation of an annual budget.
- 4 (10) To consult and cooperate with universities,
- 5 colleges, community colleges and institutes for the
- 6 development of specialized courses for police officers.
- 7 (11) To consult and cooperate with departments and
- 8 agencies of this Commonwealth and other states and the
- 9 Federal Government concerned with police training.
- 10 (12) To certify police officers who have satisfactorily
- 11 completed basic educational and training requirements as
- 12 established by the commission and to issue appropriate
- certificates to those police officers.
- 14 (13) To visit and inspect approved schools at least once
- 15 a year.
- 16 (14) To make such rules and regulations and to perform
- such other duties as may be reasonably necessary or
- appropriate to implement the education and training program
- 19 for police officers.
- 20 (15) To grant waivers of mandatory basic training to
- 21 police officers who have successfully completed previous
- 22 equivalent training or who have acceptable full-time police
- 23 experience, or both.
- 24 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
