## AN ACT

Amending the act of December 19, 1988 (P.L.1262, No.156), 1 2 entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the licensing of 3 eligible organizations to conduct games of chance, for the 4 licensing of persons to distribute games of chance, for the 5 registration of manufacturers of games of chance, and for 6 suspensions and revocations of licenses and permits; 7 requiring records; providing for local referendum by electorate; and prescribing penalties, " further providing for 8 9 enforcement.

10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

11 hereby enacts as follows:

12 Section 1. Section 13 of the act of December 19, 1988

13 (P.L.1262, No.156), known as the Local Option Small Games of

14 Chance Act, is amended to read:

15 Section 13. Enforcement.

16 (a) District attorney.--The district attorney shall
17 investigate alleged violations of this act. If the district
18 attorney finds probable cause to believe that a violation has
19 occurred, he may file a complaint against the alleged violator
20 in the court of common pleas of said county, except in counties

1 of the first class where the complaint may be filed in the municipal court. In addition, the district attorney shall 2 3 prosecute said complaint in the manner provided by law. (b) Other law enforcement officials.--Nothing in this act 4 5 shall be interpreted to restrict the power of State, county or local law enforcement officials to conduct investigations [and 6 enforce the provisions] of this act[.] and provide the results 7 of those investigations to the district attorney for enforcement 8 9 pursuant to subsection (a).

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
