- 5 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 6 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 7 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 <u>"Commissioner." The Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State</u>
- 9 Police.
- 10 "Employee." The term shall mean privately employed agents,
- 11 as defined under section 3 of the act of October 10, 1974
- 12 (P.L.705, No.235), known as the Lethal Weapons Training Act,
- 13 that are required as part of their employment to carry a
- 14 firearm.
- 15 <u>"Vest." A soft body armor vest which complies with the</u>
- 16 provisions of this chapter.
- 17 § 4302. <u>Provision of vests.</u>
- 18 (a) Requirements.--Every employee shall be provided with a
- 19 vest by his or her employer. Each vest shall be of a type
- 20 <u>commonly known or classified as Type I, Type IIA, Type II or</u>
- 21 Type IIIA in such standard classification systems as the
- 22 National Institute of Justice standards for ballistic and knife
- 23 resistance of police body armor and shall provide front, back
- 24 and side protection. Any vest which does not meet the
- 25 requirements of this section shall be immediately discarded and
- 26 replaced with a vest which complies with this section. Every
- 27 employer shall conduct monthly inspections to ensure that the
- 28 <u>vests worn by its employees are in compliance with this section.</u>
- 29 <u>(b) Regulations.--The commissioner shall promulgate</u>
- 30 regulations prescribing standards and specifications for yests.

- 1 In promulgating the regulations, the commissioner shall give due
- 2 consideration to all of the following:
- 3 (1) The maximum total weight of a vest which provides
- 4 <u>adequate protection against ballistic and knife penetration</u>
- 5 and trauma and which may be worn in comfort throughout an
- 6 <u>eight-hour tour of duty.</u>
- 7 (2) The ballistic specifications which the vest or any
- 8 part thereof must be capable of defeating.
- 9 (3) The knife perforation specifications which the vest
- or any part thereof must be capable of defeating.
- 11 (4) The requirement that vests shall provide front, back
- 12 <u>and side protection</u>.
- 13 (5) The testing procedures appropriate for determining
- the effectiveness of the vests.
- 15 (6) The labeling requirements for the vests and
- 16 <u>component parts thereof.</u>
- 17 (7) The commercial availability of conforming vests.
- 18 (c) Civil penalty.--Any employer that fails to provide a
- 19 vest under this section shall pay a civil penalty of \$1,000 for
- 20 <u>each vest that is not provided.</u>
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
