## AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 10, 1981 (P.L.214, No.67), entitled "An act relating to the lawful conduct of bingo, prescribing penalties and making a repeal," further providing for definitions, AND for rules for licensing and operation; <--PROVIDING FOR PROGRESSIVE JACKPOTS; and FURTHER PROVIDING for revocation of licenses.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The definition of "bingo" in section 3 of the act
- 10 of July 10, 1981 (P.L.214, No.67), known as the Bingo Law,
- 11 amended December 15, 1982 (P.L.1299, No.293), is amended and the
- 12 section is amended by adding definitions to read:
- 13 Section 3. Definitions.
- 14 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 15 have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
- 16 meanings given to them in this section:
- 17 \* \* \*

- 1 ["Bingo." A game in which each player has a card or board
- 2 containing five horizontal rows all but the central one
- 3 containing five figures. The central row has four figures with
- 4 the word "free" marked in the center thereof. Any preannounced
- 5 combination of spaces when completed by a player constitutes
- 6 bingo. In the absence of a preannouncement of a combination of
- 7 spaces, any combination of five in a row whether horizontal or
- 8 vertical when completed by a player constitutes bingo when its
- 9 numbers are announced and covered. A wheel or other mechanical
- 10 device may be used by any person conducting the game of bingo,
- 11 and any such person may award a prize to any player or players
- 12 first completing any combination constituting bingo.]
- 13 "Bingo." A game in which each player has a card or an
- 14 electronic representation of a card or board which contains
- 15 <u>numbers and symbols. Any preannounced combination of spaces when</u>
- 16 <u>completed by a player constitutes bingo if the numbers or</u>
- 17 symbols are announced and covered. A wheel or other mechanical
- 18 <u>device</u>, including a random number or symbol generator, may be
- 19 used by any person physically calling or electronically
- 20 <u>displaying the game of bingo and any person may award a prize to</u>
- 21 any player or players first completing any combination
- 22 constituting bingo.
- 23 "Bingo session." Authorized bingo games played until the
- 24 maximum amount of prize money, not including the progressive
- 25 jackpot, has been given out.
- 26 "Bingo supplies." Paper, pull tabs or daubers used in
- 27 conjunction with the game of bingo.
- 28 \* \* \*
- 29 "Electronic bingo device." An electronic or mechanical
- 30 device that is used by a bingo player to mark representations of

- 1 bingo card faces stored in the device and shall not include any
- 2 device into which coin, currency or tokens are inserted directly
- 3 into the device to activate play. An electronic bingo device may
- 4 be used to participate in any lawful form of bingo.
- 5 \* \* \*
- 6 "Lessor." A person that permits the conduct of bingo on a
- 7 premises owned by or leased to the person.
- 8 \* \* \*
- 9 "Prize." The maximum allowed to be paid by an association
- 10 per bingo session, not including any progressive jackpot. A
- 11 prize is not considered to be a prize until it is paid to the
- 12 winning player who must be present during the bingo session the
- 13 prize was won. The prize must be awarded to the winner in
- 14 person, either in the form of a check or cash by a bona fide
- 15 member of the association or an employee of the lessor with whom
- 16 the association is renting the premises.
- 17 "Progressive jackpot." An amount given along with the
- 18 regular prize if a win is obtained in the predetermined number
- 19 of balls or less. If the win is not obtained in the
- 20 predetermined number of balls or less, the regular game shall
- 21 continue.
- 22 Section 2. Section 5 of the act, amended OR ADDED DECEMBER
- 23 15, 1982 (P.L.1299, NO.293) AND February 12, 1988 (P.L.76,
- 24 No.14), is amended to read:
- 25 Section 5. Rules for licensing and operation.
- 26 (a) Issuance and fee.--The licensing authority shall
- 27 license, upon application, any association as defined in section
- 28 3 to conduct the game of bingo at one location in the county,
- 29 which, when in a county of the second class, shall only be in
- 30 the city, borough or township where the main business office or

- 1 headquarters of the association is located. The county treasurer
- 2 of a county of the second class shall indicate on each license
- 3 the city, borough or township where the association may conduct
- 4 bingo. The single municipal location limitation shall not apply
- 5 to a group of licensed associations conducting bingo at a
- 6 central location. The license fee to be charged to each
- 7 nonprofit association shall be \$100 per annum except to those
- 8 recognized senior citizens' groups who conduct bingo for their
- 9 members only the fee shall be \$50 per annum. The license fee to
- 10 be charged to each agricultural association or county fair shall
- 11 be \$100 per annum. Associations which conduct bingo only one
- 12 period each year for not more than three consecutive days shall
- 13 be charged \$15 for the issuance of their license. The fees
- 14 collected pursuant to this section shall be paid by the
- 15 licensing authority into the general fund of the county and used
- 16 for county purposes. All records retained by the licensing
- 17 authority relating to the issuance of bingo licenses and bingo
- 18 permits shall be public information.
- 19 (b) Display.--Licenses issued pursuant to this section shall
- 20 be publicly displayed at games conducted by licensees.
- 21 (c) Operation. -- Each licensed association shall comply with
- 22 the following restrictions and rules governing the operation of
- 23 bingo:
- [(1) No person under the age of 18 shall be permitted to
- 25 play bingo unless accompanied by an adult.
- 26 (2) No association shall conduct bingo more than twice
- in any one week, except an association shall be permitted to
- 28 conduct the game of bingo for a period not to exceed ten days
- 29 at the association's exposition, carnival or fair site in
- addition to the regularly scheduled games.

- 1 (3) Prizes awarded shall not exceed a value of \$250 for 2 any one game of bingo, except for jackpot games which shall 3 not exceed a value of \$2,000 for one such game. In addition, 4 no more than \$4,000 in prizes shall be awarded in any 5 calendar day.
  - (4) Only associations licensed to conduct bingo shall be permitted to advertise their bingo games. Such advertisements shall contain the date, time, location, whether cash or merchandise prizes will be awarded and the name of the association licensed to conduct the bingo game and the name of the individual in charge of the operation of the game. An association shall not advertise the prizes or their dollar value which will be awarded nor shall they advertise a guaranteed prize dollar value.
  - (5) The association shall own the equipment used in playing bingo or shall sign a written agreement leasing the equipment from another licensed association for a fee which is not determined by the amount of receipts realized from the playing of bingo or the number of people attending bingo games. Joint ownership of bingo equipment shall be permitted only if both owners of the equipment are licensed associations. This paragraph shall not apply to associations contracting charitable organizations or outside operators to conduct bingo at expositions, carnivals or fairs.
  - (6) The association shall own both the premises upon which bingo is played and the personal property used in the conduct of the game, or if it does not, the association shall sign a written agreement leasing such premises or personal property from the owner thereof for a fee which is not determined by either the amount of receipts realized from the

1	playing of bingo or the number of people attending bingo
2	games. An association shall not lease such premises or
3	personal property from any person who has been convicted of a

4 felony or a violation of this act.]

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- (1) No person under the age of 18 shall be permitted to play bingo unless accompanied by an adult. Children under 18 years of age shall not be permitted to play bingo using an electronic bingo device.
- (2) No association shall conduct bingo more than four times in any one week, except an association shall be permitted to conduct the game of bingo for a period not to exceed four TEN days at the association's exposition, carnival or fair site in addition to the regularly scheduled games.
  - (3) No more than \$10,000 in prizes shall be awarded in any calendar day. The value of a progressive jackpot shall not be subject to the prize limitation under this paragraph.
    - (4) (Reserved)
- (5) The association shall own the equipment used in 19 20 playing bingo or shall sign a written agreement leasing the 21 equipment from another licensed association for a fee which is not determined by the amount of receipts realized from the 22 23 playing of bingo or the number of people attending bingo 2.4 games. Joint ownership of bingo equipment shall be permitted 25 only if both owners of the equipment are licensed associations. This paragraph shall not apply to associations 26 27 contracting charitable organizations or outside operators to 28 conduct bingo at expositions, carnivals or fairs. The 29 association can be charged a per use fee on an electronic bingo device used during the bingo occasion. The per use fee 30

may not be determined by the amount of receipts realized from
the playing of bingo or the number of people attending bingo
games.

- which bingo is played and the personal property used in the conduct of the game, or if it does not, the association shall sign a written agreement leasing such premises or personal property from the owner thereof for a fee which is not determined by either the amount of receipts realized from the playing of bingo or the number of people attending bingo games. An association shall not lease such premises or personal property from any person who has been convicted of a felony or a violation of this act.
- (7) Each association shall keep written records of the moneys and merchandise collected and distributed for each day they conduct bingo. These records shall indicate the total proceeds collected, the total prize money distributed, the total value of all merchandise awarded as a prize and the amount of moneys paid as rentals or wages and to whom such rentals or wages were paid. All prizes awarded having a value greater than \$250 shall be specifically described in the association's records.
- (8) Each association shall deposit with a financial institution all proceeds for each day's bingo game in an account in the association's name. This deposit shall be made before any of the proceeds may be used for any other purpose, except for payment of prize money and compensation to members employed in the operation of the game. The following shall apply:
- 30 <u>(i) No supplier of equipment, bingo supplies or</u>

1 electronic bingo devices shall sell, offer to sell or deliver any equipment, bingo supplies or electronic bingo 2. 3 devices to any licensed organization in this Commonwealth and no organization shall buy or accept delivery of any 4 5 equipment, bingo supplies or electronic bingo devices, except on terms of <u>immediate payment or on terms</u> 6 requiring payment no later than the 15th day following 7 that on which actual delivery is made. If any payment is 8 not made when due, the supplier shall immediately notify 9 the district attorney of the county in which the 10 organization is located of the default, after which no 11 person shall sell any equipment, bingo supplies or 12 13 electronic bingo devices to the organization in default 14 on any other terms than immediate payment, until 15 otherwise authorized by the district attorney. Under penalty of suspension of its license, the organization 16 which is in default shall pay its obligation in full 17 18 within 30 days from the date it became due. (ii) No supplier of equipment, bingo supplies or 19 electronic bingo devices shall accept payment from a 20 21

(ii) No supplier of equipment, bingo supplies or electronic bingo devices shall accept payment from a licensed organization for any equipment, bingo supplies or electronic bingo devices unless that payment is in the form of a check bearing the organization's license number and drawn on the organization's separate charitable gaming account.

(iii) Any licensee who violates this section may
have its license suspended for not more than 60 days for
a first or a subsequent offense. Each failure of an
organization to make payment for any default before the
expiration of the period suspension constitutes a

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subsequent offense. Additionally, the organization may be required to make payments for all equipment, bingo supplies or electronic bingo devices subsequently purchased.

- [(9) No association shall permit any person who is not a bona fide member of the association or who has been convicted of a felony or a violation of this act to manage, set up, supervise or participate in the operation of the association's bingo games. Nothing contained in this act shall be construed to prohibit individuals under 18 years of age from participating in the operation of the game and being compensated therefor if written permission is obtained from their parent or guardian.]
- (9) An association shall permit any person who is a bona fide member of the association or an employee of a lessor to manage, set up, supervise or participate in the operation of the association's bingo games. No association shall permit any person who has been convicted of a felony or a violation of this chapter to manage, set up, supervise or participate in the operation of the association's bingo games. Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit individuals under 18 years of age from participating in the operation of the game and being compensated therefor if written permission is obtained from their parent or quardian.
  - (10) Associations which obtain a license for the purpose of conducting bingo at an exposition, carnival or fair for a period not exceeding ten days shall be permitted to contract a charitable organization to manage, set up, supervise or participate in the operation of the bingo game provided only merchandise prizes are awarded. Only bona fide members of the

- 1 contracted charitable organization shall be permitted to
- 2 participate in the operation of the bingo game. If no
- 3 charitable organizations are available, the association may
- 4 contract an outside operator to conduct the game for
- 5 merchandise at the exposition, carnival or fair site. The
- 6 provisions of this paragraph shall not be construed to allow
- 7 bingo games to be ordinarily carried out on a commercial
- 8 basis in this Commonwealth.
- 9 (11) No person shall participate in the operation of
- 10 bingo games on more than four days in any calendar week,
- which games may be operated by no more than two different
- 12 licensed associations. This provision shall not apply to
- 13 persons engaged in the operation of bingo for merchandise at
- 14 expositions, carnivals or fairs not exceeding ten days in
- 15 duration.
- 16 (12) No supplier of merchandise nor any person who has
- been convicted of a felony or a violation of this act shall
- have a pecuniary interest in the operation or proceeds of the
- 19 bingo game.
- 20 (d) Application for license. -- Each association shall apply
- 21 to the licensing authority for a license on a form to be
- 22 prescribed by the Secretary of the Commonwealth. Said form shall
- 23 contain an affidavit to be affirmed by the executive officer or
- 24 secretary of the association stating that:
- 25 (1) No person under the age of 18 will be permitted by
- the association to play bingo unless accompanied by an adult.
- 27 Children under 18 years of age shall not be permitted to play
- 28 <u>bingo using an electronic bingo device.</u>
- 29 (2) The facility in which any game of bingo is to be
- 30 played does have adequate means of ingress and egress and

- 1 adequate sanitary facilities available in the area.
- 3 licensed association of the equipment used in playing bingo

The association is the sole or joint owner with a

- 4 or it leases the equipment from another licensed association
- 5 under a written agreement for a fee which is not determined
- 6 by the amount of receipts realized from the playing of bingo
- 7 or the number of people attending bingo games. This paragraph
- 8 shall not apply to associations contracting with charitable
- 9 organizations or outside operators to conduct bingo at
- 10 expositions, carnivals or fairs.

- 11 (4) The association is the owner of both the premises
- upon which bingo is played and the personal property used in
- the conduct of the game or, if it is not, that the
- 14 association is not leasing such premises or personal property
- from the owner thereof under an oral agreement, nor is it
- leasing such premises or personal property from the owner
- 17 thereof under a written agreement at a rental which is
- determined by either the amount of receipts realized from the
- 19 playing of bingo or the number of people attending bingo
- games, nor is it leasing such premises or personal property
- 21 from a person who has been convicted of a felony or a
- 22 violation of this act.
- 23 (5) The association will not conduct the playing of
- bingo more than [twice] four times per week in any one week,
- 25 except those associations conducting bingo at expositions,
- 26 carnivals or fairs.
- 27 (6) The association in any calendar day will not award a
- 28 total of more than [\$4,000] \$10,000 in prizes.
- 29 (7) The association is a nonprofit association as
- 30 defined in this act.

- 1 [(e) Limitation on compensation. -- No person may be employed
- 2 in the operation or the actual running of a bingo game for
- 3 compensation greater than \$50 per day, except employees of
- 4 outside operators under section 5(c)(10), and any person
- 5 compensated shall be paid individually by check or by cash, in
- 6 which case the payee shall sign a written receipt therefor. In
- 7 addition, no person shall receive compensation from more than
- 8 one source for services rendered in the operation of a bingo
- 9 game.]
- 10 (e) Compensation. -- Any person compensated shall be paid
- 11 individually by check or by cash, in which case the payee shall
- 12 <u>sign a written receipt.</u>
- 13 (f) Investigation of association. -- The licensing authority
- 14 may request an investigation to verify the statements made in
- 15 any application for a license.
- 16 Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 17 Section 5.1. Progressive jackpots.
- 18 (a) Permitted.--A licensed charitable organization or
- 19 organizations playing at the same location may deposit a
- 20 <u>predetermined amount of money before each licensed call bingo</u>
- 21 <u>session into a special account in order to offer a progressive</u>
- 22 jackpot prize.
- 23 (b) Participating organizations. -- A participating
- 24 <u>organization may conduct a progressive jackpot game which shall</u>
- 25 be in conjunction with the organization's regular bingo games.
- 26 (c) Contents.--A progressive jackpot shall consist of all
- 27 contributions made by participating organizations.
- 28 (d) Method of winning. -- A progressive jackpot is won along
- 29 <u>with a regular jackpot prize when a player achieves a win in a</u>
- 30 predetermined number of balls or less. If the win is not

- 1 obtained in the predetermined number of balls or less, the
- 2 <u>organization's regular game shall continue.</u>
- 3 (e) Checking account. -- A separate checking account shall be
- 4 opened by the participating organization for the progressive
- 5 jackpot. The following shall apply:
- 6 (1) The account shall be in the name of "Charitable
- 7 Gaming Progressive Jackpot Account" which shall be imprinted
- 8 on all checks. Checks from this account shall require two
- 9 <u>signatures.</u>
- 10 (2) If the organizations are using a lessor, the lessor
- shall designate a representative who shall make deposits of
- 12 <u>all funds contributed to the progressive jackpot by 10:00</u>
- 13 a.m. on the next banking day and who shall be responsible for
- 14 maintaining the checking account in accordance with generally
- 15 <u>accepted accounting principles.</u>
- 16 (3) <u>Designated representatives of the</u> lessor and each
- 17 participating organization shall be authorized signatories on
- 18 the account and shall be in attendance at the location at the
- 19 conclusion of each respective organization's progressive
- jackpot game for the purpose of issuing a check bearing
- 21 signatures of the lessor representative and the organization
- 22 representative from the special account to the winner. If no
- 23 lessor is involved, the organization shall have two of its
- 24 <u>representatives at the location to sign and issue a check.</u>
- 25 (4) All banking fees and costs shall be borne by the
- lessor or the organization, if no lessor is involved.
- 27 (f) Contribution. -- Each participating organization shall
- 28 <u>submit a check to the designated lessor representative for the</u>
- 29 <u>predetermined amount prior to the commencement of the</u>
- 30 organization's scheduled call bingo session made payable to the

- 1 charitable gaming progressive jackpot account. The contribution
- 2 shall be nonrefundable except in the event of premises closure.
- 3 Each predetermined contribution shall constitute part of the
- 4 total amount of prizes awarded during that call bingo session.
- 5 If no lessor is involved, the organization shall make a check
- 6 payable to its charitable gaming progressive jackpot account.
- 7 The contribution shall be nonrefundable except in the event of
- 8 premises closure. Each predetermined contribution shall
- 9 constitute part of the total amount of prizes awarded during
- 10 that call bingo session. The following shall apply:
- 11 (1) The dollar amount of the progressive jackpot shall
- be continuously and conspicuously displayed during all bingo
- 13 <u>sessions conducted by participating organizations at the</u>
- 14 <u>location within view of all patrons purchasing progressive</u>
- 15 <u>jackpot cards</u>.
- 16 (2) All checks written to a charitable gaming
- 17 <u>progressive jackpot account shall be reported as part of the</u>
- 18 bingo reports when requested by the local district attorney's
- 19 office.
- 20 (3) The organization involved in the progressive jackpot
- 21 <u>may establish a maximum cap. Participating organizations may,</u>
- 22 prior to the progressive jackpot being won, raise but may not
- lower the maximum jackpot or cap. The following shall apply:
- (i) In the event that the maximum progressive
- jackpot or cap established is reached, the organizations
- 26 <u>may continue to make contributions to the charitable</u>
- 27 gaming progressive jackpot account in order to accumulate
- 28 <u>a second or subsequent jackpot. Once the maximum jackpot</u>
- or cap is reached, the participating organizations shall
- 30 not offer any subsequent progressive jackpot prize until

- the time that the first progressive jackpot prize is won.
- 2 (ii) The dollar amount of the maximum jackpot or cap
- 3 as established by the organizations shall be continuously
- 4 and conspicuously displayed with the current dollar
- 5 <u>amount of the progressive jackpot.</u>
- 6 Section 4. Section 6 of the act, amended December 15, 1982
- 7 (P.L.1299, No.293), is amended to read:
- 8 Section 6. Revocation of licenses.
- 9 (a) Grounds.--The licensing authority shall revoke or refuse
- 10 to renew the license of any association whenever the district
- 11 attorney finds upon investigation that:
- 12 (1) Any of the funds derived from the operation of the
- game of bingo are used for any purpose which does not support
- 14 the nonprofit purposes of the association.
- 15 (2) Any person under the age of 18 unaccompanied by an
- 16 adult is playing bingo as herein defined.
- 17 (3) The facility in which any game of bingo is played
- does not have adequate means of ingress and egress or does
- 19 not have adequate sanitary facilities available in the area.
- 20 (4) [Greater compensation than is herein authorized has
- 21 been paid to or received by any person, or that a person or
- 22 persons other than those authorized in section 5 have been
- involved in managing, setting up, operating or running the
- game.] (Reserved).
- 25 (5) The association conducts bingo using bingo equipment
- 26 which it does not own solely or jointly with another licensed
- 27 association or which it leases in violation of the statement
- contained in its license application provided by section
- 29 5(d)(3).
- 30 (6) The association conducts bingo upon premises which

- it does not own or with personal property it does not own and is either:
- (i) leasing such premises or personal property used in the conduct of the game from the owner thereof under an oral agreement;
- 6 (ii) leasing such premises or personal property from
  7 the owner thereof under a written agreement at a rental
  8 which is determined by either the amount of receipts
  9 realized from the playing of bingo or the number of
  10 people attending bingo games; or
- 11 (iii) leasing such premises or personal property
  12 from a person who has been convicted of a felony or a
  13 violation of this act.
- 14 (7) False or erroneous information was provided in the 15 original notarized application.
- 16 (8) An association has been convicted of a violation of
  17 this act as evidenced by a certified record of the
  18 conviction.
- 19 (b) Production of records. -- The district attorney may
- 20 require the licensees to produce their books, accounts and
- 21 records relating to the conduct of bingo in order to determine
- 22 whether a license should be revoked or renewal thereof denied.
- 23 Licensees shall also be required to produce their license,
- 24 books, accounts and records relating to the conduct of bingo to
- 25 other law enforcement officials upon proper request.
- 26 (c) Possible revocation. -- The licensing authority may revoke
- 27 the license of any association if he finds that the association
- 28 has knowingly employed any person in the operation of their
- 29 bingo game who has been convicted of a violation of this act.
- 30 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
