## INTRODUCED BY D. EVANS, MARCH 10, 2008

SENATOR ARMSTRONG, APPROPRIATIONS, IN SENATE, RE-REPORTED AS AMENDED, JULY 2, 2008

#### A SUPPLEMENT

$1 \\ 2 \\ 3 \\ 4 \\ 5 \\ 6 \\ 7 \\ 8 \\ 9 \\ 10 \\ 11 \\ 12 \\ 13 \\ 14 \\ 15 \\ 16 \\ 17 \\ 18 \\ 19 \\$	To the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State- related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations, for a method of accounting for the funds appropriated and for certain fiscal information disclosure.
20	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
21	hereby enacts as follows:
22	Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be

23 necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the

24 University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 2008, to

June 30, 2009, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown: 1 2 (1) For educational and general expenses..... \$166,777,000 3 For student life initiatives..... 435,000 (2) 4 To enhance the recruitment and retention (3) 5 of disadvantaged students..... 442,000 (4) For the teen suicide center at the Western 6 7 8 (5) For rural education outreach..... 2,157,000 9 2,557,000 (5) FOR RURAL EDUCATION OUTREACH..... <-----10 Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on 11 account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal 12 13 year.

14 Section 3. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of 15 the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly 16 during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

23 Section 4. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the 24 moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are 25 permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 26 27 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act 28 relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file, with the 29 Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor 30 General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each - 2 -20080H2315B4187

branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and
 purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by
 this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year,
 as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any
 appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be 6 (b) 7 reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by 8 9 this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes 10 not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered 11 and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys 12 13 other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General 14 shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually 15 with the General Assembly such information concerning such 16 expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees 17 may require.

Section 5. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 2009, shall cover the 12 month period beginning with the summer <-----

7	instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction
8	scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by
9	two digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP)
10	categories of instructional programs of higher education as
11	defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United
12	States Department of Education.
13	(iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.
14	(2) For the summer term and the following academic year in
15	total and for each two digit CIP program category, a
16	classification of faculty members or other professional
17	employees by title, including: professor, associate professor,
18	assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate,
19	librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other
20	professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type
21	of assignment: teaching and nonteaching; and each such set of
22	faculty members or other professional employees to be further
23	subdivided by type of employment: full time or part time; and
24	the following aggregates for each such subdivided
25	<del>classification:</del>
26	(i) The number of faculty and other professional employees
27	and their full time equivalence in instructional and
28	noninstructional functions.
29	(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom

courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels. 2 3 (iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate 4 individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned 5 to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and 6 doctoral course levels. 7 8 (iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours 9 10 generated, divided into lower division, upper division, 11 master's, first professional and doctoral course levels. 12 (v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student 13 credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, 14 15 upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course 16 levels. 17 (vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and 18 for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary 19 paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal 20 funds and other funds. 21 (3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty 22 member employed full time identified by two digit CIP program category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the 23 24 average hours per week spent in university related activities, 25 stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom 26 contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in

27 preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public 28 service.

Section 6. In addition to the requirements in section 5 29 30 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12 month

period beginning with the summer term 2008 shall include for all 1 2 programs of the university: 3 (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate 4 degree and for a master's degree. 5 (2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 2004, 2005, 6 2006, 2007, 2008 and estimated 2009. 7 8 Section 7. (a) The following words and phrases when used in this section shall have the meanings given to them in this 9 10 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 11 "Academic and administrative support units." Any organizational entity, as defined in the organizational manual 12 13 of the university, that reports directly to the president of the 14 university, chief academic officer or vice president, including 15 the office of the president, chief academic officer and vice 16 president. 17 "Expenditures." Disbursements or payments of State 18 appropriations, tuition and fees supporting operational, 19 educational or other general categories of expenses as defined 20 in: the generally accepted accounting principles as prescribed 21 by the National Association of College and University Business 22 Officers, the American Institute of Certified Public 23 Accountants, or by their successors, or by any other recognized authoritative body; the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget 24 25 Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-26 Related Universities and Non State Related Colleges and 27 Universities"; and the financial reporting policies and standards promulgated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and by 28 29 the Federal Government that apply to the University of 30 Pittsburgh.

1 "Revenue." All State appropriations and tuition and fees. (b) The University of Pittsburgh shall disclose the 2 3 following: 4 (1) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the university's 5 academic and administrative support units for the current fiscal 6 <del>year.</del> (2) The actual revenue and expenditures for the prior year 7 in the same format as the information reported under paragraph 8 9 (1). 10 (3) For any defined project or program which is the subject of a specific line item appropriation from the General Fund, the 11 university shall disclose the following: 12 13 (i) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the defined program or project for the current fiscal year. 14 15 (ii) The actual revenue and expenditures of the defined program or project for the prior year in the same format as the 16 17 information reported under paragraph (1). 18 (4) The revenue and expenditures of any auxiliary enterprise which is directly funded in whole or in part by tuition or a 19 20 State appropriation for the current fiscal year. 21 (c) The university shall provide the following additional 22 information for the prior fiscal year for each academic or administrative support unit, for each defined project or program 23 24 and for any auxiliary enterprise: 25 (1) The number of employees by academic rank and by 26 classification the number of administrators, staff, clerical and 27 technical service employees. 28 (2) Median and mean salary by academic rank and by classification the median and mean salaries of administrators, 29 30 staff, clerical and technical service employees.

1 (3) Nonsalary compensation as a percentage of salary. Nonsalary compensation shall include, but not be limited to, 2 3 medical benefits, life insurance benefits, pension benefits, 4 leave benefits, employer Social Security payments and workers' 5 compensation benefits. (4) A statement of the university's retirement policies. 6 7 (5) A policy statement relating to a reduction of tuition 8 for employees' family members. 9 (6) A list of purchase of service contracts which exceed 10 \$1,000 by category of service, including, but not limited to, 11 legal, instructional, management, accounting, architecture, public relations and maintenance. The list shall contain the 12 13 name and address of the contractor, a statement of the nature of 14 the duties of the contractor and the academic and administrative 15 support unit for which the duties are performed. If a purchase 16 of service contract exceeds 10% of the total aggregate 17 expenditure of the contract category per academic or 18 administrative support unit, then the contracted amount shall 19 also be listed. 20 (7) A list of purchase of goods contracts which exceed \$1,000. The list shall contain the name and address of the 21 22 contractor and a list of the goods purchased and the academic or 23 administrative support unit for which such goods were contracted. If a purchase of goods contract exceeds 10% of the 24 25 total aggregate expenditure per academic or administrative 26 support unit, then the contracted amount shall also be listed. 27 (8) A list by academic or administrative support unit in the 28 aggregate, of the expenses of travel, subsistence and lodging, whether provided or reimbursed. 29 (d) The university shall submit a report of the information 30

Section 8 5. The University of Pittsburgh shall provide
full, complete and accurate information as may be required by
the Department of Education or the chairman or the minority
chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the
chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations
Committee of the House of Representatives.

10 Section <del>9</del>6. The University of Pittsburgh shall present and 11 report its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with: the generally accepted accounting 12 13 principles as prescribed by the National Association of College 14 and University Business Officers, the American Institute of 15 Certified Public Accountants, or their successors, or by any 16 other recognized authoritative body; the "Commonwealth of 17 Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher 18 Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related 19 Colleges and Universities"; and the financial reporting policies 20 and standards promulgated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 21 and by the Federal Government that apply to the University of 22 Pittsburgh.

23 Section <del>10</del> 7. The University of Pittsburgh shall make all <-24 articulation agreements with other higher education institutions 25 available on the Internet.

26 Section <del>11</del> 8. No funds appropriated by this act may be used <--27 for costs of personnel and operations of the environmental law 28 clinic.

29 Section 12 9. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008, or 30 immediately, whichever is later.
