## A RESOLUTION

1 Declaring March 2007 as "Irish American Heritage Month" in  
2 Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, On March 17, 2007, the Irish community in this  
4 Commonwealth will celebrate the occasion of the feast of the  
5 glorious Apostle of Ireland, Saint Patrick; and

6 WHEREAS, "St. Patrick, the Teacher, Bless our school  
7 communities and their families" is the theme of the 2007 St.  
8 Patrick's Day Parade in Philadelphia; and

9 WHEREAS, Fleeing political, religious and racial persecution  
10 in their homeland, Irish immigrants arrived on our shores  
11 penniless and unwanted, yet filled with hope that America held a  
12 future in which they and their children would enjoy the

1 bountiful fruits of a nation founded upon the principles of  
2 liberty and justice for all; and

3 WHEREAS, In every phase of our national history, Irish  
4 Americans have taken their place at the forefront in the  
5 political, economic, religious, social and artistic fields; and

6 WHEREAS, Their contribution to the good and welfare of this  
7 Commonwealth is immeasurable and unflinching; therefore be it

8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives declare March  
9 2007 to be "Irish American Heritage Month" in Pennsylvania and  
10 extend its felicitations and best wishes to the Irish community  
11 in this Commonwealth on this momentous occasion; and be it
