3	WHEREAS, America's public, academic, school and specialized
4	libraries help people change the world; and
5	WHEREAS, Our nation's libraries play an integral role as
6	community, educational and cultural centers that bring together
7	diverse populations and serve as important cornerstones in
8	healthy communities; and

9 WHEREAS, Two-thirds of adult Americans, approximately 13510 million people, visit their local public libraries annually; and

WHEREAS, In 2005, the National Center for Education
 Statistics published a report revealing that total visits to
 public libraries nationwide approached 1.3 billion, or 4.6
 visits per capita, in the 2003-2004 fiscal year; and
 WHEREAS, Libraries are a cost-effective means of providing
 education, training and the opportunity for self-improvement to

7 all individuals without regard to age, race, income or 8 socioeconomic background; and

9 WHEREAS, Libraries play a unique role in ensuring the 10 public's right to know and empowering people from all walks of 11 life to make informed decisions about the world around them; and 12 WHEREAS, A 2006 American Library Association survey found 13 that 85% of respondents believe libraries and librarians play an 14 essential role in our democracy and are needed now more than 15 ever; and

16 WHEREAS, Libraries are a key player in the national discourse 17 on intellectual freedom, equity of access and narrowing the 18 digital divide; and

19 WHEREAS, Libraries are a vital connection to the people, 20 places and ideas of the world through books, magazines, videos 21 and the Internet; and

22 WHEREAS, Currently 98.9% of public libraries provide free 23 Internet access, making them the preeminent source of Internet 24 access for people without computers at home, school or work; and 25 WHEREAS, Libraries are dynamic places with a variety of 26 activities that provide free, safe and enriching entertainment 27 for the whole family; and

28 WHEREAS, Public awareness and support for libraries,
29 librarians and library workers may be increased by raising their
30 visibility in a positive context and by communicating clearly
