1 WHEREAS, Tourism is Pennsylvania's second-largest industry 2 and a major contributor to the economy of this Commonwealth, 3 providing approximately \$26 billion in visitor spending and 4 nearly 600,000 jobs; and

5 WHEREAS, Almost 138 million people visit Pennsylvania6 annually for business and leisure; and

7 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is the fourth-most-visited state in the8 United States; therefore be it
