1 2 3 4	Honoring the life and heroic death of United States Army Air Corps Staff Sergeant Robert Flood, who paid the supreme sacrifice on July 7, 1944, when his B-24 bomber was shot down over Bernburg, Germany.
5	WHEREAS, In 2003, German archaeologist Eurico Schwartz
6	discovered the remains of the crew of a B-24 United States Army
7	Air Corps bomber that was shot down over Bernburg, Germany; and
8	WHEREAS, The identity of the remains was unknown until DNA
9	taken from suspected and potential survivors was compared with
10	the DNA of the remains; and

WHEREAS, On Father's Day 2007, Sgt. Flood's family learned

that his remains had been recovered and were being sent home for
burial; and

3 WHEREAS, Until that point, Sgt. Flood's family had believed 4 that his plane was lost over the English Channel and hence was 5 unrecoverable; and

WHEREAS, Twice before, Sgt. Flood's planes had crashed, once 6 in England on May 11, 1944, and once on June 15, 1944, and after 7 the June 15 crash, Sgt. Flood and his surviving crew mates, with 8 the help of French citizens, made it back to American lines; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Sgt. Flood grew up on a farm in Huntingdon County 11 and was a 1941 graduate of Orbisonia High School; and WHEREAS, Sgt. Flood enlisted in the Army Air Corps while 12 13 employed at the Letterkenny Army Depot near Chambersburg; and 14 WHEREAS, Sgt. Flood was laid to rest in Upper Tuscarora 15 Valley Cemetery and was given full military honors and an 16 honorary flyover by a United States Air Force KC-767 tanker 17 transport aircraft; and

18 WHEREAS, Sgt. Flood is survived by his brother, Richard, and 19 by several nieces; and

20 WHEREAS, It is fitting for Pennsylvanians to pay homage to a 21 war hero for his courageous service to our nation; therefore be 22 it
