A RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing the Congress of the United States to budget and
- appropriate certain funding for the Low Income Home Energy
- 3 Assistance Program.
- 4 WHEREAS, The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program
- 5 (LIHEAP) was established by the Congress of the United States
- 6 under Title XXVI of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of
- 7 1981 and was implemented in 1982; and
- 8 WHEREAS, LIHEAP is a vital lifeline to low-income families,
- 9 senior citizens and persons with disabilities in meeting their
- 10 residential heating and cooling needs; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Low-income families, 40% of whom are senior
- 12 citizens, and many working poor individuals in this Commonwealth
- 13 face a continuing energy crisis with energy burdens that exceed
- 14 15% of their household incomes, compared to 3.4% for all other

- 1 households; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The Federal funding for LIHEAP significantly eases
- 3 the home energy affordability crisis faced by millions of
- 4 Americans; and
- 5 WHEREAS, President George W. Bush's budget proposal for
- 6 fiscal year 2009 would cut LIHEAP funding by \$570 million, which
- 7 is a 22% cut from fiscal year 2008 even before adjusting for
- 8 changes in energy prices; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Current LIHEAP funding allows it to service only
- 10 about 15% of the people who are eligible, and President Bush's
- 11 budget would cut this number even further; and
- 12 WHEREAS, More than one million low-income and elderly
- 13 individuals already receiving LIHEAP money would be cut from the
- 14 LIHEAP program to meet President Bush's budget; and
- WHEREAS, Although there has been a 65% increase in home
- 16 energy prices since 2001, there is a 0% increase in this year's
- 17 LIHEAP budget relative to fiscal year 2001; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Many low-income individuals in this Commonwealth do
- 19 not have sufficient income to pay for the basic necessities of
- 20 life and are experiencing a crisis in paying home energy bills,
- 21 thereby contributing to a health and safety crisis which is a
- 22 national crisis; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The number of families on LIHEAP has decreased every
- 24 year since 2001, and the continued diminution of funding for
- 25 LIHEAP will threaten the continuation of the Commonwealth
- 26 program that is the foundation for providing a modest amount of
- 27 energy security for low-income families of this Commonwealth;
- 28 and
- 29 WHEREAS, Maintaining or increasing LIHEAP funding should
- 30 entitle this Commonwealth to a proportionate share of the LIHEAP

- 1 funds and would enable more people facing severe weather and
- 2 decreased income to help meet their future needs for energy
- 3 assistance; therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 5 Commonwealth memorialize the Congress to provide an
- 6 appropriation for LIHEAP in fiscal year 2009, and each fiscal
- 7 year thereafter, at a level adjusted for inflation which equals
- 8 or exceeds the fiscal year 1982 regular program funding level;
- 9 and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 11 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each
- 12 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
