A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating May 12, 2008, as "Pennsylvania Health Care Information Technology Day."
3	WHEREAS, Health care costs represent 16% of gross domestic
4	product nationally; and
5	WHEREAS, Seventy percent of health care transactions are
6	paper-based; and
7	WHEREAS, The health care industry invests only 2% to 3% of
8	revenue on information technology and management systems, versus
9	10% to 15% of other data-intensive industries, such as banking;

L1	WHEREAS, Recent studies have demonstrated that widespread
L2	adoption and effective use of health care technology, such as
L3	electronic medical records systems and other information

management systems, can save the United States health care
system \$162 billion annually; and

3 WHEREAS, The Institute of Medicine reports there are at least 4 1.5 million preventable adverse drug events per year, each 5 adding more than \$8,700 to the cost of a hospital stay; and 6 WHEREAS, The United States spends more than \$1.9 trillion on 7 health care a year, yet one-half of that spending is 8 unnecessary, spent on clinical and administrative waste, theft 9 and excess cost; and

10 WHEREAS, The American Hospital Association reports that this 11 Commonwealth's hospitals and health systems are outpacing hospitals nationally in their adoption and use of clinical 12 13 information technology and information management systems; and 14 WHEREAS, Health care providers in this Commonwealth report an 15 improved ability to recruit physicians coming out of medical 16 school when advanced information technology is employed at their 17 sites; and

WHEREAS, Despite leadership in this area, only 17% of hospitals in this Commonwealth report that most of their medical practitioners routinely use information technology for clinical interventions, such as ordering medications; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate May 12, 2008, as "Pennsylvania Health Care Information Technology Day"; and be it further

25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the 26 importance of raising awareness of health care information 27 technology and the vital role it will play in helping to save 28 lives and reduce the cost of health care for all Pennsylvanians; 29 and be it further
