A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating a commission composed of public and private cost-minded
- leaders of this Commonwealth to study the management of
- 3 current government operations and make recommendations
- 4 regarding the merger and consolidation of certain government
- 5 operations.
- 6 WHEREAS, The economic health of this Commonwealth is a top
- 7 priority; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The tax burden on this Commonwealth's citizens and
- 9 businesses resulting from the cost of government operations and
- 10 administration can have a significant impact on the economic
- 11 health of this Commonwealth; and
- 12 WHEREAS, State government has an obligation to be fiscally
- 13 responsible and to limit the tax burden it imposes; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Ten cents of every public dollar spent is committed
- 15 to general government operations; and
- 16 WHEREAS, An organized bipartisan effort is necessary to

- 1 determine ways in which State government can be made more
- 2 effective and more efficient; therefore be it
- RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 4 create a government management and cost study commission
- 5 composed of leaders from the public and private sectors to study
- 6 Commonwealth government operations and the experience of other
- 7 states in an effort to propose changes that will reduce costs,
- 8 increase accountability and improve service; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the commission make recommendations regarding
- 10 the merger and consolidation of operations in executive agencies
- 11 and legislative agencies; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the commission be comprised of ten members as
- 13 follows:
- 14 (1) Two members to be appointed by the Governor, with
- one of the appointments being a member of the general public.
- 16 (2) Two members to be appointed by the Majority Leader
- of the Senate and two members to be appointed by the Minority
- 18 Leader of the Senate, with no more than one appointment from
- 19 each authority being a government official or employee.
- 20 (3) Two members to be appointed by the Majority Leader
- of the House of Representatives and two members to be
- 22 appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of
- 23 Representatives, with no more than one appointment from each
- 24 authority being a government official or employee;
- 25 and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That these appointments be made within 30 days of
- 27 the adoption of this resolution; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the commission make a report of its findings
- 29 and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly no
- 30 later than November 30, 2008, at which time the commission shall

- 1 cease to exist; and be it further
- 2 RESOLVED, That the chairman rely on the existing staff of the
- 3 appointing authorities and the Appropriations Committee of the
- 4 Senate and the Appropriations Committee of the House of
- 5 Representatives to the greatest extent possible; and be it
- 6 further
- 7 RESOLVED, That necessary and reasonable costs and
- 8 expenditures of the commission be authorized to be paid from
- 9 funds already appropriated by the General Assembly to the Office
- 10 of the Budget and the Office of Administration; and be it
- 11 further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the commission comply with all the duties and
- 13 responsibilities of an agency under 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating
- 14 to open meetings).
