A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of November 16 through 22, 2008, as "National Geography Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania and
- November 19, 2008, as "Pennsylvania Geographic Information
- 4 System Day."
- 5 WHEREAS, A geographic information system (GIS) is a computer
- 6 system application capable of capturing, storing, analyzing and
- 7 displaying geographically referenced information; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The information in GIS applications can include
- 9 street addresses, municipal boundaries, streams and watersheds,
- 10 labor markets, land use zones, property boundaries, public
- 11 utilities, census tracts, transportation networks, oil well and
- 12 gas well locations, wildlife management areas and more; and
- 13 WHEREAS, GIS applications are used for business management,
- 14 homeland security, public health, land use planning, labor
- 15 market analysis, transportation, environmental protection,
- 16 agriculture, law enforcement and economic development; and
- 17 WHEREAS, GIS applications relay information in a spatial

- 1 context, allowing users to analyze complex spatial
- 2 relationships; and
- 3 WHEREAS, A GIS is an objective decision-making tool that is
- 4 becoming increasingly useful for private industry and
- 5 governmental entities; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Department of Labor has identified geospatial
- 7 technology, including GIS, as one of the three technologies with
- 8 the greatest potential for growth and job creation; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is a leader in geospatial technology
- 10 research and training and possesses many of the leading
- 11 geospatial technology firms in the United States; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Investment in geospatial technology by government,
- 13 private industry and academia will keep this Commonwealth in the
- 14 forefront of the industry; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 16 week of November 16 through 22, 2008, as "National Geography
- 17 Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania and November 19, 2008, as
- 18 "Pennsylvania Geographic Information System Day."
