## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	Designating a portion of State Route 26 in Centre County as the Marine Sergeant David "DJ" Emery, Jr. Highway; and designating the bridge on State Route 322 joining Clearfield and Centre Counties as the Veterans' Memorial Bridge; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 850 IN MARYSVILLE BOROUGH, PERRY COUNTY, AS THE ARMY PRIVATE DAVID E. DIETRICH MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; AND DESIGNATING A PORTION OF U.S. ROUTE 322 IN CENTRE COUNTY AS THE THOMAS D. LARSON MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

L O	hereby enacts as follows:
L1	Section 1. Marine Sergeant David "DJ" Emery, Jr. Highway.
L2	(a) Declaration of policyThe General Assembly finds and
L3	declares as follows:
L4	(1) David "DJ" Emery, Jr., was born August 23, 1985. He
L5	graduated from Bellefonte Area High School in 2003 and
L6	studied masonry at the Centre County Vocational-Technical
L7	School. He was always an active outdoorsman and has a love of
L8	motorcycles.
L9	(2) Emery enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in
20	June 2003 and, following completion of basic training was

- deployed to Iraq in 2004 and then again in 2006.
- 2 (3) Private First Class Emery served with distinction in
- 3 the 4th Battalion, 2nd Marines, 2/4 Gulf Company until
- 4 February 7, 2007, when he was seriously wounded in an attack
- 5 by a suicide bomber.
- 6 (4) Emery was promoted to Sergeant on May 9, 2007.
- 7 (b) Designation. -- State Route 26 in Marion and Spring
- 8 Townships, Centre County, from segments 450/748 to 570/000 is
- 9 hereby designated as the Marine Sergeant David "DJ" Emery
- 10 Highway.
- 11 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 12 maintain appropriate signs to indicate the designation under
- 13 subsection (b).
- 14 Section 2. Veterans' Memorial Bridge.
- 15 (a) Designation. -- The bridge joining Clearfield and Centre
- 16 Counties on State Route 322 is designated and shall be known as
- 17 the Veterans' Memorial Bridge.
- 18 (b) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 19 maintain appropriate signs which shall display the name of the
- 20 bridge designated in subsection (a) at each end of the bridge
- 21 and at the sides of the bridge so that persons traveling on
- 22 State Route 322 can see the designation referred to in
- 23 subsection (a).
- 24 SECTION 3. ARMY PRIVATE DAVID E. DIETRICH MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 25 (A) DECLARATION OF POLICY.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND

- 27 (1) DAVID E. DIETRICH WAS BORN JANUARY 14, 1985. HE
- 28 GRADUATED FROM SUSQUENITA HIGH SCHOOL, PERRY COUNTY, IN 2004.
- 29 HE WAS ACTIVE IN BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA, TROOP 56, AND THE
- 30 MARYSVILLE FIRE COMPANY.

- 1 (2) PRIVATE DIETRICH ENLISTED IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY
- 2 IN MARCH 2006, GRADUATED FROM THE UNITED STATES ARMY TRAINING
- 3 CENTER AT FORT KNOX, KENTUCKY, ON JULY 20, 2006, AND A SHORT
- 4 TIME LATER WAS DEPLOYED TO IRAQ.
- 5 (3) PRIVATE DIETRICH SERVED WITH DISTINCTION IN F TROOP,
- 6 1ST CAVALRY REGIMENT, 1ST BRIDGE COMBAT TEAM, 1ST ARMORED
- 7 DIVISION UNTIL DECEMBER 29, 2006, WHEN HE WAS FATALLY WOUNDED
- 8 WHEN HIS COMBAT PATROL UNIT CAME UNDER ATTACK BY SMALL ARMS
- 9 FIRE FROM ENEMY FORCES IN AR RAMADI, IRAQ.
- 10 (B) DESIGNATION.--STATE ROUTE 850 THROUGHOUT MARYSVILLE
- 11 BOROUGH, PERRY COUNTY, IS HEREBY DESIGNATED AS THE ARMY PRIVATE
- 12 DAVID E. DIETRICH MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 13 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 14 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS TO INDICATE THE DESIGNATION UNDER
- 15 SUBSECTION (B).
- 16 SECTION 4. THOMAS D. LARSON MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 17 (A) DECLARATION OF POLICY.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND
- 18 DECLARES AS FOLLOWS:
- 19 (1) THOMAS D. LARSON SERVED AS SECRETARY OF
- 20 TRANSPORTATION FROM 1979 TO 1987 DURING GOVERNOR RICHARD
- 21 THORNBURGH'S ADMINISTRATION.
- 22 (2) THOMAS D. LARSON IS RECOGNIZED AS THE INDIVIDUAL WHO
- 23 WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN REFORMING THE PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF
- 24 TRANSPORTATION AND MAKING IT A NATIONAL MODEL OF
- 25 PROFESSIONALISM AND INNOVATION.
- 26 (3) AFTER COMPLETING HIS SERVICE AS SECRETARY, THOMAS D.
- 27 LARSON WAS SWORN IN AS FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATOR ON
- 28 AUGUST 10, 1989, AND SERVED UNTIL 1993.
- 29 (4) DURING HIS TENURE AS FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATOR,
- 30 HE PLAYED AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN THE CRAFTING OF THE INTERMODAL

- 1 SURFACE TRANSPORTATION EFFICIENCY ACT OF 1991 (ISTEA) (PUBLIC
- 2 LAW 102-240, 105 STAT. 1914).
- 3 (5) BEFORE AND AFTER HIS PUBLIC SERVICE TO THE
- 4 COMMONWEALTH AND THE UNITED STATES, THOMAS D. LARSON ALSO
- 5 DISTINGUISHED HIMSELF AS A RESEARCHER AND PROFESSOR OF CIVIL
- AND ENVIRONMENTAL ENGINEERING AT THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE 6
- 7 UNIVERSITY, COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING, AND IN PREPARING THE NEXT
- 8 GENERATION OF TRANSPORTATION PROFESSIONALS.
- 9 (6) PENNSYLVANIA LOST A DEDICATED PUBLIC SERVANT,
- TEACHER AND COMMUNITY LEADER ON JULY 20, 2006. 10
- 11 (B) DESIGNATION.--U.S. ROUTE 322 IN HARRIS, COLLEGE AND
- PATTON TOWNSHIPS, CENTRE COUNTY, FROM SEGMENT NOS. 450/748 TO 12
- 13 570/000 IS HEREBY DESIGNATED AS THE THOMAS D. LARSON MEMORIAL
- 14 HIGHWAY.
- 15 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
