## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for a limit on handgun
- 3 purchases and sales; and establishing the Violence Prevention
- 4 Fund.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 6111.6. Limit on handgun purchases.
- 10 (a) Purchase of handgun.--No person may purchase more than
- 11 one handgun in this Commonwealth within any 30-day period.
- 12 (b) Sale of handgun. -- No person may sell or cause to be sold
- 13 to a person in this Commonwealth more than one handgun within
- 14 any 30-day period.
- 15 (c) Exceptions.--This section shall not apply to the
- 16 following:
- 17 <u>(1) A licensed firearm dealer.</u>
- 18 (2) A licensed firearm collector.

(3) A law enforcement agency or an agency authorized to
perform law enforcement duties.
(4) State and local correctional facilities.
(5) A private security company licensed to do business
within this Commonwealth.
(6) The purchase or sale of antique firearms.
(7) A person whose handgun is stolen or irretrievably
<pre>lost if:</pre>
(i) the person provides the seller with an official
copy of the police report of the lost or stolen handgun,
or a summary of the report on a form provided by the
Pennsylvania State Police;
(ii) the police report or summary contains the name
and address of the handgun owner, the description of the
handgun, the location of the loss or theft, the date of
the loss or theft and the date the loss or theft was
reported to the law enforcement agency;
(iii) the date of the loss or theft as reflected on
the police report or summary occurred within 30 days of
the person's attempt to replace the handgun; and
(iv) the seller attaches an official copy of the
police report or summary of the report to the original
sales receipt or other document evidencing the original
sale and retain it for the period prescribed by
regulation of the Pennsylvania State Police.
(d) Grading
(1) Except as set forth in paragraph (2), a person that
is convicted of violating subsection (a) or (b) commits a
misdemeanor of the third degree.
(2) A person that, after being sentenced under paragraph

- 1 (1), is convicted of violating subsection (a) or (b) commits
- 2 <u>a felony of the third degree.</u>
- 3 (e) Disposition of fines collected. -- The court imposing and
- 4 <u>collecting a fine under subsection (d) shall transfer the fines</u>
- 5 thus collected to the State Treasurer for deposit in the
- 6 Violence Prevention Fund under subsection (f).
- 7 (f) Violence Prevention Fund. -- There is established in the
- 8 General Fund a nonlapsing, restricted receipt account to be
- 9 known as the Violence Prevention Fund. Money in the fund is
- 10 hereby appropriated to the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and
- 11 <u>Delinquency solely for purposes of violence prevention and youth</u>
- 12 <u>violence prevention, including youth education and activities</u>
- 13 <u>designed to prevent violence and grants to law enforcement</u>
- 14 agencies for equipment and training designed to prevent gun-
- 15 <u>related injuries.</u>
- 16 (q) Notice.--A seller shall notify each prospective
- 17 purchaser that the purchase of more than one handgun in a 30-day
- 18 period is prohibited under this section and of the applicable
- 19 penalties.
- 20 (h) Handqun purchase history check.--In addition to any
- 21 other duty prescribed by this section, a seller of a handgun
- 22 shall request the Pennsylvania State Police to conduct a handqun
- 23 purchase history check to investigate whether the prospective
- 24 <u>handgun purchaser is in compliance with this section. A handgun</u>
- 25 <u>purchase history check shall be conducted in accordance with the</u>
- 26 procedures governing other background checks under this
- 27 subchapter. A handqun purchase history shall be conducted at the
- 28 <u>same time any criminal history, juvenile delinquency or mental</u>
- 29 <u>health records check is required for a firearm purchase under</u>
- 30 this subchapter. Information related to a handoun purchase

- 1 provided to the Pennsylvania State Police by a seller may be
- 2 retained by the Pennsylvania State Police as necessary to
- 3 monitor compliance with this section.
- 4 (i) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 5 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 6 <u>subsection:</u>
- 7 <u>"Handgun." Either of the following:</u>
- 8 (1) A firearm which has a short stock and is designed to
- 9 be held and fired by the use of a single hand.
- 10 (2) Any combination of parts from which a firearm
- described under paragraph (1) can be assembled.
- 12 <u>"Licensed firearm collector." A person who collects firearms</u>
- 13 and is licensed as a collector under 18 U.S.C. § 923 (relating
- 14 to licensing).
- 15 "Licensed firearm dealer." A person who is licensed as a
- 16 <u>firearm dealer under 18 U.S.C. § 923 (relating to licensing).</u>
- 17 "Purchase." Does not include the exchange or replacement of
- 18 a handqun by a seller for a handqun purchased from the seller by
- 19 the same person seeking the exchange or replacement within the
- 20 30-day period immediately preceding the date of exchange or
- 21 replacement.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
